## Washington News Letter By Congressman O. C. Fisher

Tax reform, foreign aid, military training, high prices, agriculture and reclamation, were among the subjects covered in President Truman's annual State of th Union message last week.
The President appeared in per son, as is his custom, and looked hale and hearty as he read his message to the joint session For the first time in history the proceedin was recorded by television.
The press picked the tax reform recommendation as the feature highlight of the message. Th President proposed that every tax payer, regardless of income, be given a credit of $\$ 40$ on his tax bill this year, and an additiona $\$ 40$ for each dependent. Thi would amount to $\$ 3,200,000,000$ and would, according to the pro posal, be made up by an increase of corporate taxes in a simila amount. Eight million would be removed from the tax rolls.
But the Republicans are in control now, with majorities in both the House and Senate, and will likely bring out a bill fashioned after the one that was vetoed last year. The latest proposal would re duce income taxes by $30 \%$, th bottom to amount $10 \%$ at the top and raise the present exemption by $\$ 100$. This would remove about 6 million from the rolls, in the lowest million from
income group.
It seems apparent that any re lief from the high wartime taxes will depend on reducing government expenditures. Conversely, is may be that the government ex-
penditures will not be reduced penditures will not be reduced
very much unless there is a tax re very much unless there is a tax re
duction. If the money comes in pressing need is usuatty found for it. Expenditures were cut by Congress nearly $\$ 4$ billion this year from budget requests, and the Treasury now estimates that there will be a $\$ 6$ billion surplus on July first. That should make it possible to make a substantial payment on the huge public debt. So if govern
ment expenses can be held down and further reduced, as should be, and if foreign aid is limited, some tax relief seems possible.
The degree of incentive for ven ture capital is a subject of much talk these days. Looking at in dividual income taxes, Presiden Truman's salary is a good example He gets $\$ 75,000$ a year and
$\$ 43,092$ of that goes back to the government in taxes. A man who makes $\$ 100,000$ a year today pays the Treasury $\$ 63,128$. If he makes $\$ 500,000$, the federal tax bill is $\$ 407,464$, according to the Department of Internal Revenue. And if he makes a million a year, Uncle Sam takes $\$ 839,715$ ! And if the income is from corporate investments, the corporation pays on an income tax and the individual stockholder pays on his dividends from the corporate profits. So, on the same income the corporation first pays and then the individual investor pays on the part that distributed as profits.
distributed as profit
But corporate incomes have been high in recent years, and those who suffer the ming costs of living are existing high costs of living are low-income groups and whit collar workers with fixed incomes. Perhaps compromises can result and moderate tax relief and needed adjustments can be agreed upon this year.
