Coke County Oil Being Shipped To Eastern Refinery

With a larger supply of crude oil needed to keep their refinery running at Philadelphia, Pa., Sun Oil Company is hoping to increase its Coke county output materially during the coming year. With that idea in mind drilling operations in the immediate future will be centered in proven territory rather than wildcat explorations.

At present nearly 3,000 barrels of high gravity oil are produced by Sun's 24 finished wells in northwestern Coke county. The daily allowable output in 140 barrels, while only a few wells produce less Oil is pumped from Silver by the Scurlock Pipeline company to Colorado City. There is is emptied into tank cars which move over the Texas & Pacific railway to East Texas. There it is pumped into a Sun owned pipeline and goes to a port on the Gulf where it is loaded into tankers and goes on back to Philadelphia by water.

Extent of the new Arledge field six miles northwest of Sanco, opened by Sun early in the year, is still unknown No. 1 Arledge, the dis-covery, produced from the Marble Falls slightly below 6,600 feet.
