The test will be No. 1 Fred Mc-Cabe, 1,980 from the south, 660 feet from the east line of section 25, block Z, D&SE Ry. Co survey, on the Divide 10 miles southwest of Robert Lee. It will be in the center of a 14,500 acre block acquired early in 1947. Operations are expected to start by Aug. 15.


To The Citizens of Coke County
