

The county commissioners have not been able to agree on an appointee, and the apparent deadlock seems destined to continue hospital facilities made available to until the first of the year.

This situation is embarrassing to the public and is causing concern among patrons of the common school districts. The office should not be left vacant any longer. Since Commissioners Smith and Brooks state they have no intention of changing their minds, we hope that Commissioners Harmon and Varnadore give in this time, As to the future decisions, however. we hope they stay stand pat 'til heck freezes over,

#### Why a County Hospital?

The Observer has favored a county hospital ever since the matter was suggested a year ago. We firmly believe it should be built from tax money because under that procedure every person will contribute his equitable share of the cost.




