President Truman, presenting a President Mruman, presening a
poopsal for the largest peacetime
budget in U. S . history to the congress, was greeted with the expected reaction. Dem crats ap-
plauded, Republicans instantly deplauded, Republicans instantly demanded deep slashes in recommend-
ed outlay. It became evident quichy that the fight on adoptio
of the budget would be carried out
strictly along party strictly along party lines.
THE PRESIDENT declared
would take 41 billion, 858 millio dollars to run the government righ
for the next year. And the punch can tax dollar would be spent to hold back the Communist tide in
the world. On a party line basis, approval
of the budget was assured, assum-

Despite the prevalence of many

the counter of a chain store gets cents.
This leaves 17 cents to the chain with which it must pay all its in-
cidental expenses and 10 cents of
this, or about in wages to employes of the chain. IN PAYING 17 cents to the
chain the customer thus lays out chain the customer thus lays out
that amount for the chain's combined wholesale and retail services. After the 10 cents goes to employes,
the remainder is allocated in this the remainder is allocated cents for warehousing and cartage a little over one cent for shrinkage, spoilage and theft, and one-half cent
for advertising. This leaves from for advertising. This leaves from
one to one and one-half cents net
profit to the chain, less income pront to the chain, less income
taxes of one-half to one cent.
These figures werer developed in These figures were developed in
the latest in a series of price studies by the family economics bureau of
the Northwestern National Life Insurance company The survey disclosed that indi-
vidual markups vary widely of course, within the store, being
much higher than the general 17 per cent average on perishable
items like fresh fruit and items like fresh fruit and vege-
tables, and much lower than average on very competitive staples
like sugar. ACCORDING TO the study result, he average food chain markup
before the war was $221 / 2$ cents -a third greater than today.
Today's far greater dollar volume per store, and therefore per employe, is mainly responsible for
