## Sun Mathers No. 10 Tops Jameson Field With 470 Barrels

Sun
No. 10 C. E. Mathers gauged 470 barıels of high gravity oil during its official 24 -hour test the last of the week to become the
top producer in the Jameson field top producer in the Jameson field
at Silver. Bottomed at 6,345 feet the well flowed naturally with a gas-oil ratio of $1,491-1$. Test was through a quarter inch choke. Previous best producers in the
area were the J. B Walker wells south of the river which made about 450 barrels. One of the Fred Jameson producers last year was
rated above 500 barrels, but the rated above
opening was larger than a quarter inch during part of the test. Sun No. 12 Homer Jameson
flowed 306 barrels during its potential 24 -hour test after being treated with 5,000 gallons of acid. Gas-oil ratio was 1,418-1. The well is located just back of the Sun
Camp at Silver and was completed at a depth of 6,486 feet.
