

# Robert Lee received a heavy 132,000 Barrels Oil

Sun Oil Co. produced 132,359 totaled 1.82 inches of moisture, barrels of high gravity oil from 56 the year of 2.88 inches. Farmers during the month of January. and ranchmen are much encouraged. Three of the producers are in the new Millican field west of Edith, two in the Arledge field north of Sanco and the others are located in the Jameson field at Silver.

The Jameson field has an allowable daily production of 111 barrels, with 4 days shut down in January, while there will be only 23 producing days in February. South of the river at Silver the daily allowable is still 140 barrels, and at Edith the allowable is 120 barrels. Sun has eleven rotary rigs drilling in Coke county, eight in the Silver area and three at Edith.

H. D. Smith, area superin-tendent at Silver, said Thursday he could not confirm rumors going around this week that Sun planned to make drastic cuts in drilling operations here. Since crude production in Texas will be given a Robert Lee contributed \$359.51, which \$209 came from business March, there is likely to be some retrenchment in all areas.




