These plans were develop. ment to treat each acre according to its needs Personnel of the Soil Conservation Service assisted the land owners and operators develop heir plans.
Claud Anderson, a member of the Valley View Conservation completed a 2500 cubic yard farm pond last week. The stock pond wil. give better distribution of livestock and prevent trampling out of the range vegetation around my watering places, Anderson said. Land owners should begin to make plans to seed rye and hairy
vetch, R. B. Al'en, chairman vetch, R. B. Al'en, chairman of
the Board of Supervisors advises. They should begin to prepare their land for seeding as soon as we get some fall rains. Seed bed preparation is just as important in seeding of cover crops as any other crops, Allen said.
If land owners do not plan and regulate the grazing of their range
grasses, they can destroy the im. provement of their ranges which they have made during the year, is the statement made by C. N
Webb, vice chairman of the Board f Supe visors. If the land owners will leave about half of the vegetation on the land that has grown
each year, the old crop litter will each year, the old crop litter will
help impiove the range, Webb said. The litter will increase the water intake during rainfall, retard the runoff. reduce the soil temperature, and reduce evaporation, Webb commented. The more water that we can put into the
soil and keep in the ground the soil and keep in the ground, the
more grass we will grow, Webbadd ed.
