## Failure Of Wells <br> Causing Serious <br> Water Shortage

Robert Lee faces an immediate
water shortage, according to a statement issued by Mayor McNeil Wylie this week. A serious
situation has arisen because of a gradual weakening of the two city wells east of town.
Mayor Wylie asks everyone to conserve water as much as possible during the water emergency. If and when the supply is more plen tiful the public will be advised. An effort is being made to clean is that the water is giving out be. cause of continued dry weather. water in the old city lake, accord ing to Sam Jay, water super intendent.
Both of the wells now in use were drilled last year. The best one tested 200 galions per minute at the start but is now only good for 30 gallons. The other well formerly pumped 150 gallons. Now It is apparent that some good rains in the near future would solve the water problem until the new Mountain Creek reservoir can be put into use. The dam and filtering plant will be finished in early summer but no one knows
when it will rain encugh to fill the reservoir.
Mayor Wylie and Commissioners Fern Havins and John Brown held an official session Tuesday night, following the election in opposition. Only 29 ballots were cast, but the present administration was given full endorsement a few weeks ago when the city vo ed $\$ 65,000$ bonds
The city will let a contract R. B. Thornton \& Son just as soon as the bond money is avail able. There has been a delay be cause a contract with the UCRA had not been signed, and this will be necessary before the water re venue bonds can be sold. All details have been agreed upon and there are no apparent obstacles to near future.
Thornton \& Son of Brady were low with a bid of $\$ 54,088$ for conand laying 4,350 feet of 8 -inch water main and 4,330 feet of 6 -inch water pipe. The city may reduce the amount by not buying a mast er meter and omitting a steel fence around the filtering plant. It will also be possible to save $\$ 3,000$ by re-laying the string of 6 -inch pipe running to the water plant now in use.
