self inflicted, but relatives believe the gun was discharged accidentthe g
ally.

Clift, left Wayne at home whil se went to a grocery store to buy a chicken for lunch. She said he appeared in excellent spirits and had suggested the chicken for the
meal. He had been busy planning Earlier Wayne had told his wif that he wanted to clean the gun.
Wayne was born in Robert Lee
May 19, 1905. He graduated from the local high schnol and worked
in the McCollum-Reed mercantil in the McCollum-Reed mercantile
store for some time. He later was store for some time. He later was
employed at the Cumbie store for a number of years bef ute becoming on West Beauregard in San Angelo.
More than 11 years ago he was injured in an auto accident. Re-
turning with his wife and small son from a Thanksgiving visit with relatives on the plains, near Sweetwater their car was sideswiped

received a broken back and bruised spinal chord which left him paryzed from the waist down. His wife and her sister also sustained

## A Noble Try

Back in 1879 Missouri's first fish commission made a noble experi-
ment in restocking the state's streams with fish. Although it failed, the experiment has been called the first sincere attempt to restock mid-
west streams. The commission's first act was to establish a fish hatchery where
speckled trout and such exotic speseces as California salmon, Atlantic
white shad and German carp were
hatched.
The California salmon and white
shad are migratory species which live in the ocean except during
early spring when they move up
freash-water rivers and streams to spawn. It was believed that these
species, released in Missouri, would
