# **Union Strikes Oil** On Jim McCutchen

Most important local oil news of the past week was the completion of Union's No. 3 Jim Mc-Cutchen, four miles east of Robert Lee. The location is between two dry holes.

No. 3 McCutchen drilled into the pay section (Cisco sand) Saturday and flowed 20 barrels per hour on a drillstem test from 3,985. 4,000 feet. A 10-foot core was then cut, the last 8.8 feet of which


