## WTU to Build Huge Power Plant in Coke

West Texas Utilities Company
announced Thursday plans for constructing a large multi million dotlar power plant in Coke County. The new plant will be located on Oak Creek Lake in the northeastWTU will spend an estimated $351,000,000$ during the next five years for construction of new electric facilities in West Texas. New generating equipment for WTU, including one new power plant in $\left.\begin{array}{l}\text { Coke county is expected to cost } \\ \text { over } \\ \hline 22,500,000\end{array}\right)$ and will increase by more than two-thirds the company's system generating capability
The 117 acre site selected for the power plant is on the west shore
of Oak Creek Lake and is immediately adjacent to Highway 70 which runs form Sweetwater to Bronte. A 57 acre portion of the site has been purchased from the pany is negotiating with Charles Copeland, Coke County ranchman, for the purchase of an additional Constructoin of the new power plant will begin early next year,

scheduled to be in operatton in 1961. The ultimate capacity of the plant will be 225,000 kilowatts.
The new plant is to be located $111 / 2$ miles north of Bronte and. three and one-half miles south of

tely in the geographic center of the company's system. Being almost equidistant from Abilene and
