## Deer, Turkey Season Opens

 In Coke Nov. 16of years Coke County will be op-
ened for hunting deer, turkey and ened for hunting deer, turkey and
quail.
The deer and turkey open sea-
son starts Saturday, Nov, 16, and continues through Dec. 31, both dates inclusive. The quail season extends from Dec. 1 through Jan.
16. Bag limits are two bucks with pronged horn per season and three turkey gobblers per season. Shoot-
ing hours are from 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after
sunset.
There are no restrictions on the type of guns which may be used,
except that shotguns used in hunting turkeys must be plugged to a
3 -shell capacity. 3-shell capacity.
All persons hunting deer and turkey are required to have a license. The license costs $\$ 3.15$ and may be
purchased at the County Clerk's office, from C. D. Vann, game warden at the Sheriff's office, or
at the Percifull Hardware Store

## Hunters under 17 years of age

 are advised to secure an exempt charge. This also applies to adults hunting on their own premises.
