County Agents News Column

I have had a number of men ask me how do we keep the county clean now that we have completed or virtually—we still lack one herd—the initial brucellosis testing. The question is a difficult one to answer. According to the law, the local law enforcement officers are responsible for the enforcement, but for all practical purposes if the program is to be

effective, the operators in the county will have to observe and honor the law. The local officials would have a difficult time keeping abreast of all the cattle transactions.

The regulations set out by the State Animal Health Commission on the subject are very specific. They were printed once when we were in the process of testing. Since we have received so many questions on the subject, I would like to rerun them. They are as follows:

The Texas Animal Health Commission rules and regulations re-

quire that all cattle except steers, spayed heifers, calves under eight months of age and officials vaccinated calves under 30 months of age consigned to a premise in any county in which Type II brucellosis work is being conducted or has been completed will have to comply with the following:

1. Cattle originating in a modified certified brucellosis county or certified brucellosis herds and accompanied by a health certificate, when kept separate and apart from other cattle in clean pens used for that purpose ONLY, can move without further tests.

2. Cattle from other than modified certified counties accompanied by official health certificate showing negative to brucellosis test within 30 days, kept separate and apart from other cattle in clean pens used for that purpose ONLY, can be moved directly to owners premises, under quarantine, retested in not less than 30 nor more than 60 days, and, if negative, released.

3. Cattle that do not comply with paragraphs 1 and 2 must be negative to a brucellosis test before leaving the livestock market. They can then be moved to owners' premises, under quarantine, retested at his expense in not less than 30 nor more than 60 days, and, if negative, released.

Mr. Elliott, the government trapper co-sponsored by Coke County and a group of interested operators in the county, had an active period during the last 12 months. It is difficult to place a monetary value on so erratic an animal as the bobcat, coyote, red fox and all small varmints, but certainly he has relieved some critical situations and has kept other losses from occurring by taking the predators of which he has rid the county.

During the past two month reporting period Mr. Elliott took five bobcats, one coyote, six red fox and an estimated 25 other fox and small varmints. During the past 12 months, he has taken 24 bobcats, four coyotes and 45 red fox. Also, an estimated 250 small varmints and other fox were disposed of. He has been on 57 different assignments in the area, working some of these twice, and a few, three times. And he has prepared 2500 baits for various operators during the period. Not all of the above animals were killers, but we can assume that a number of them were. Removing the ones that were predators has no doubt helped greatly in controlling stock losses in the county.
