Untreated Wounds Hamper Program
now being reported in many counties throughout the area where sterile flies are being dispersed ould lead to widespread infestation such as that experienced in 1962, unless livestock producers conscientiously follow precautions handling their livestock.
Reports being received by erad ny producers feel the prote that ma progressed to a point vidual sed a point that indisures are no longer required meattitude, if left unchanged, could eriously hamper eradications f forts, authorities state.
For that reason, eradication cials have issued an urgent appeal to producers, asking them to mears and sprays that will preent screwworm attacks and colect and submit samples from all infestations detected.
Eradication workers point out while an increasing number of counties are reporting infestations, as yet no large build-up of native screwworms is evident. They feel if producers will make every effort to treat open wounds before screwworm flies are attracted to them, the native flies can be overwhelmed through the release of sterile flies. Screwworm flies will lay eggs only on C. G. Scruggs
