so did not give me any agement, and one man canno raise this kind of money single handed. Both the local leadership and majority chose this method Whether the hospital got out of the frying pan into the fire by forming the district remains to be seen.
When private capital will no meet a need, government is brought in, simply because the voters bring it in. Our position is that we must do the best we can with what we have.
Your Editor will speak out what he believes. But he will live in peace and friendship with your decision.
