Money Saving Food Ideas Could you feed a family of 11 on $\$ 20$ a week? This small sum would have to provide a 90 -cent meal for all eleven people. It can be done, but only with a struggle. Assuming the family does not five on a farm, they would have to buy nearly all of their needs To get the required foods our body needs, we should have milk, fruit and vegetables, eggs or fish and cereal.
Potatoes and milk could be the mainstay of the diet. They could hardly afford while fluid milk but they could use powdered milk and receive the greatest amount of food value - protein, mins Sufficient Vitamin A mins Sufficient Vitamin A and would be missin
Vitamin C would be supplied by potatoes if they were cooked in their skins or baked. Potatoes at least twice a day would fill up he "empty space.
Cereal and bread would probably be the third food stuff we would include, preferably whole grain for the greatest yield in food nutrients. Oatmeal could be the standard breakfast. Whole wheat or rye meal flour would be best for bread.
Protein would come mostly from eggs, which could be stretched in the form of pancakes or French toast to give everyone a share. Any meat would have to be ground beef, a stew meat, liver or sausage, where there is no waste. Dried beans and peas could supplement the protein supply of milk. Beans also provide iron.
If she swallowed her pride a bit, the homemaker could ask the grocer for vegetable trimmings usually thrown away - such as the nutritious outer leaves of lettuce. Any splurging on vegetables should go for carrots, rich in Vitamin A. Macaroni and rice could be served with tomatoes, possibly some cheese.
Hungers for sweets and fats can best be acquired with sugar and lard. Woncers" can be performed with a bacon square, the least expensive form of bacon. It can give flavor to gravy, spaghetti sauce, and other dishes When all the meat has been cut from the rind, use it to grease

PLAIN OMELETS are prepar ed exactly like scrambled eggs, but are not scrambled during cooking. All ingredients are combellow in color mixed until light yellow in color and then poured into a frying pan containing melted butter.
Cooking is always over low heat. Plain omelets are also re ferred to as flat or French ome lets. These omelets are tenderly compact in texture, moist and have a delicately browned bottom side. They may be served as is, fopped with cheese or a sauce, or filled.
FLUFFY OMELETS require two bowls for the mixing stage The egg whites are beaten until stiff but not dry in the first bowl. The yolks and seasonings are whipped to a light yellow in the second bowl and then folded into the egg whites.
The mixture is poured into a trying pan or baking dish con-
taing melted butter and cooked or baked until lightly browned and the top surface "springs back" when lightly touched. Fluffy omelets are frequently served as a dessert. They also are referred to as "puffy" omelets.
To make a WHIPPED CREAM OMELET, use whipped cream for the liquid in the puffy omelets about 1 pint for every six eggs is puffy omelets and serve with parmesan cheese topping for an entree or a rich fruit sauce for

Some of the liquids which may be used in the preparation of omelets include whole milk, cream, half and half, evaporated milk, nonfat dry milk, water, mushroom liquid, tomato juice and fruit juices.
Most chefs an
like to reserve one frying pan skillet or baking pan just for baking omelets. The reason is that an omelet pan should never be washed with detergent or scouring powder which has a tendency

County Agents News Column

screwworm cases have found in Coke County. We have had a number of samples submitted, but only the one case found on the Spade Ranch was reported to be screwworms. For a dry year the number of fleece worms and other maggot types has been fairly high.

## I saw some wet country last week - and more dry coun and Wichita Falls appears to

 have had some heavy rainfall week before last. The low places were full of water in most of that area.Our purpose in passing through that area was to attend the National Soil Judging Contest. Our team failed to place among the leaders, but did have a good educational experience. They were competing against 35 other teams from 30 states. One little slip and you are out of the running.

The latest we have from down state in the way of an estimate on when to expect the pecan nut dicates the hatch will be five to ten days earlier than normal. This means, based on their findings, we can expect the casebear er between May 15 and 25 .

ist at Texas A\&M University. In sexas instances, zinc ha been included in fertilizers con taining other plant nutrients and improved crop growth has been
noted. But, unless a check plot is fertilized in a similar manner but without zinc, the improved growth cannot always be attributed to the addition of the zinc There are conditions under
which zinc deficiency has been which zinc deficiency has been
found and these may serve as a guide. Alkaline soils, those with a pH above 7.5 , show a higher incidence of zinc deficiency due to the lower availability of zinc in alkaline soils. Most of Coke County's soils fit this pH cate-
gory.
If zinc deficiency is suspected it can be corrected on the pre-
sent crop by a foliar spray. sent crop by a foliar spray.
Welch suggests the use of a one-fourth to one-half percent solutions of zinc sulfate or che-
lated zinc along with a detergent lated zine along with a detergent
as a wetting agent. Dissolving as a wetting agent. Dissolving
from one to two pounds of either zinc sulfate or chelate in 50 gal lons of water will give proper solution. Do not make the solu tion too concentrated, since the
leaves can be more easily damag. leaves can be more easily damag-
