





TRESPASSING

No person, corporation or association shall erect or construct or proceed with the erection or construction of any building or structure, nor add to, move, alter, extend or demolish any building or structure upon lands owned by the District or waters impounded in the reservoir owned by the District without first applying for and obtaining a building permit therefor from the District.
