Gas Rate Raise

Lone Star Gas Co. May 19 asked the City of Robert Lee to increase local residential and commercial natural gas rates by approximately 10 per cent. Company officials said it would enable Lone Star to earn a reasonable rate of return on the fair value of properties used to serve the public.

The application for rate increase listed increased cost of buying gas, higher property and equipment costs, increased costs for employees compensation, higher interest rates on borrowed money and increased taxes as primary reasons for the income deficiency.

"In addition," stated M. D. Geiser, manager of the San Angelo distribution office, "Lone Star has a commitment to its customers to vigorously compete for supplies of natural gas to keep its reserves in a favorable position. While other sections of the country are experiencing some shortages of natural gas, Lone Star has maintained favorable supplies. The gas cost adjustment portion of the application placed before he City Council," continued Geiser, "will help Lone Stan maintain its favorable gas supply position and assure our customers of natural gas service for the future "

Approval of the application for an increase would raise the average monthly residential gas bill by approximately 79 cents, Geiser said. Lone Star serves more than 275 customers in Robert Lee.






