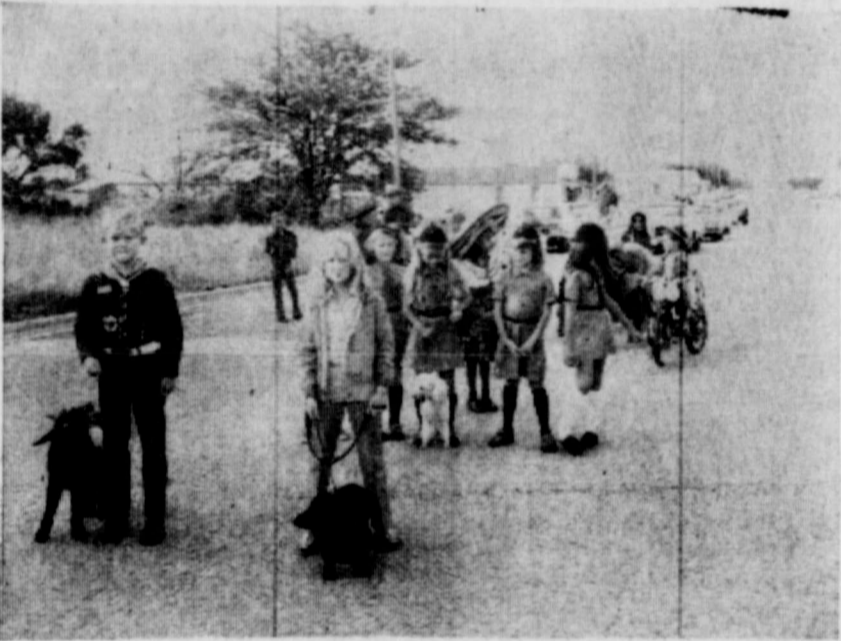

Cool nights and mornings and warm afternoons have been on the weather menu this week.

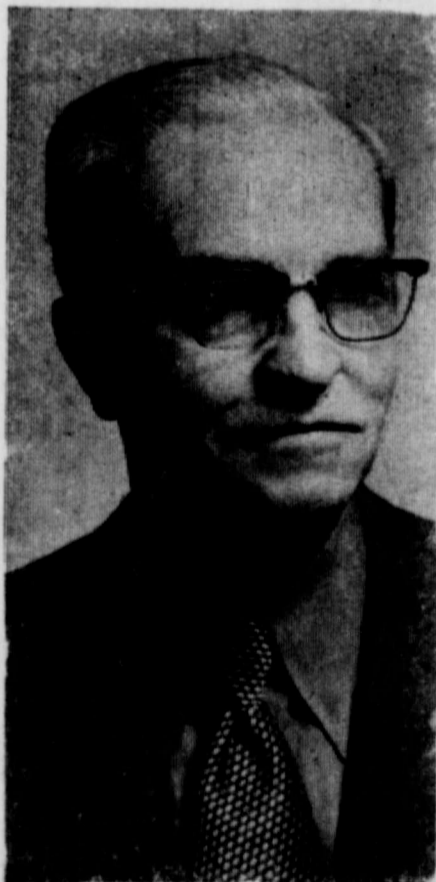
### Taylor Promoted By Land Bank

Herbert H. Decker, president of the Federal Land Bank of Houston, announced that George L. Taylor of San Angelo has been promoted to assistant vice president effective Sept. 1.

Taylor, a native of Cookville, Tex., attended public schools in Cookville, Mt. Pleasant and Commerce and graduated from high school in Commerce. He received his B. S. degree from East Texas State University in 1936 where he also attended graduate school.

Taylor served in the public schools at Robert Lee from 1928 to 1946 as teacher, athletic coach, high school principal and 10 years as school superintendent. He was manager of the Federal Land Bank Association of San Angelo until 1951 when he joined the Federal Land Bank as a regional manager. He was promoted to district manager in 1970.

**SHOOTING VICTIM SAID IN SATISFACTORY CONDITION**  
Eugene A. Stewart of San Angelo was reported this week to be in satisfactory condition after suffering wounds in an accidental shooting incident Monday.

According to police reports, Stewart was in Angelo Gun Shop at 10 E. Concho looking over the shotgun and rifle display when a woman entered the shop and told a clerk a shotgun she had was not working properly. When the clerk broke the action to clear the weapon, the gun discharged, sending a shell into a glass showcase. Pellets ricocheted off the showcase and struck Stewart in the arm and groin.

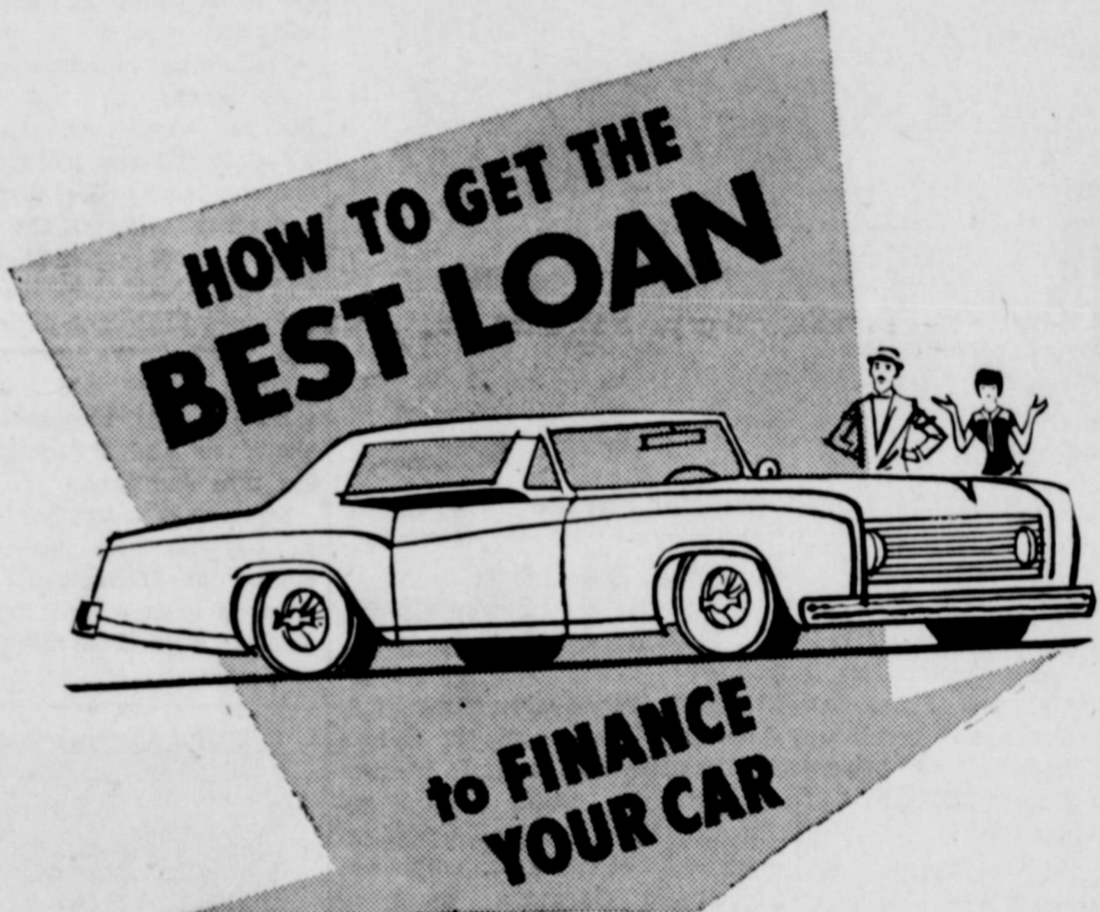

The Steers made a 1st at the 11, but that was all for the Steers and they tried a field goal from that point. The attempt was blocked and the ball ended up on the Roscoe 6. The Steers held and Roscoe punted to their 35, with Wolfe returning to the Plowboy 24. One play and the quarter ended.

#### Second Quarter

The Steers made a 1st at the Plowboy 7 and from the 1 yard line Abalos plunged over for the score. Abalos kicked the extras and the Steers led 7-0.

Abalos kicked off to the Roscoe 5 with a return to their 24. Roscoe made a 1st at their 35. The Steers held at the Roscoe 19 on a loser and on the attempted punt Wibby Millican and Costillo broke through and blocked it with Costillo recovering at the 11. The Steers went for a 1st on the 1 and then something happened as they fumbled at the 8 yard line and Roscoe recovered. Roscoe made a 1st at their 22, then another at the 39. But then Roscoe fumbled and Sockwell recovered at the 36 yard line. The Steers were held on downs and the Plowboys took over. They made a 1st at the 46 and the Steers then threw them for a loss to the 36 as the half ended.

#### Third Quarter

Roscoe kicked off to the Steer 10 with Abalos returning to the 39. Roscoe held after short yardage and Mumford punted to the Plowboy 29. Roscoe made a 1st at the Steer 49 but then the Robert Lee defense held and the punt went to the Steer 16. The Steers got only 6 yards and on the attempted punt, they miscued and Roscoe ended up with the ball at the Steer 14 yard line. Then the Steers showed how mean they are and held on downs at the 12 yard line. The Steers quickly made a 1st at the 24 but that's all and Mumford punted to the Plowboy 43 yard line. Roscoe ran one play and the third quarter ended.

#### Fourth Quarter

Roscoe made two quick 1st downs to the Steer 27 yard line, but the Steers then halted them and Roscoe punted to the Steer 14. Robert Lee moved for a 1st at the 24 and for another at the 42. Then in came Wibby Millican to give somebody a rest and he went off tackle, cut to the sideline and 58 steps later he had another Steer TD. The extras failed but the score now stood at 13-0.

That TD must have given Abalos a shot of adrenalin as he kicked off clear out of the end zone and Roscoe took the ball at the 20. Roscoe made a 1st at their 39, but the Steers halted them there on downs. Roscoe stopped the Steers for little gain and Mumford punted to the Roscoe 41. The Plowboys couldn't move on their attempts and the Steers took over at their own 49. They ran two plays and the gun went off to signal the end of the game.

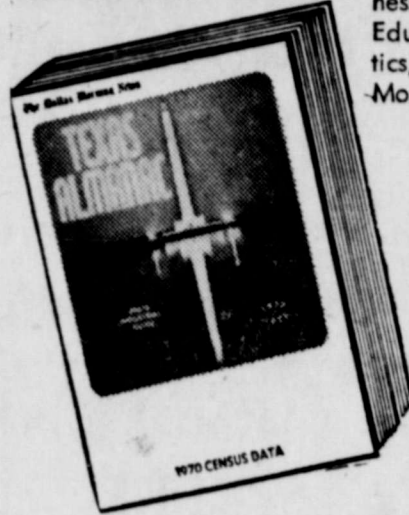
