The annual budget worked out would be approximately \$5,000. The budget would take care of keeping the library open 15-20 hours per week by a salaried person, supplies, rental space, shelving and other incidentals as well as the books mentioned above.

He was born Oct. 26, 1909, in Bell County. He moved to Winters with his parents in 1911 and attended Winters schools. He and Miss Opal Lett were married May 5, 1929, in Winters and moved to Robert Lee in 1930. He was engaged in the grocery business and had ranching interests. He had been semi-retired for two years.

He was a veteran of World War II and a member of American Legion Post 381 and Woodmen of the World Lodge. He was a Baptist.

Survivors include his wife; two sons, Bobby Baker and Ronnie Baker, both of Robert Lee; a daughter, Mrs. Dick (Sandra Kay) Bentman of Odessa; three brothers, Clyde Baker of San Angelo, Johnnie Baker of Ballinger and Fred Baker of Abilene; two sisters, Mrs. Anna Mae Springfield and Mrs. Cora Lee Springfield, both of Abilene; and seven grandchildren.

Five cheerleaders, three twirlers and a drum major were announced for the 1973-74 school term this week.

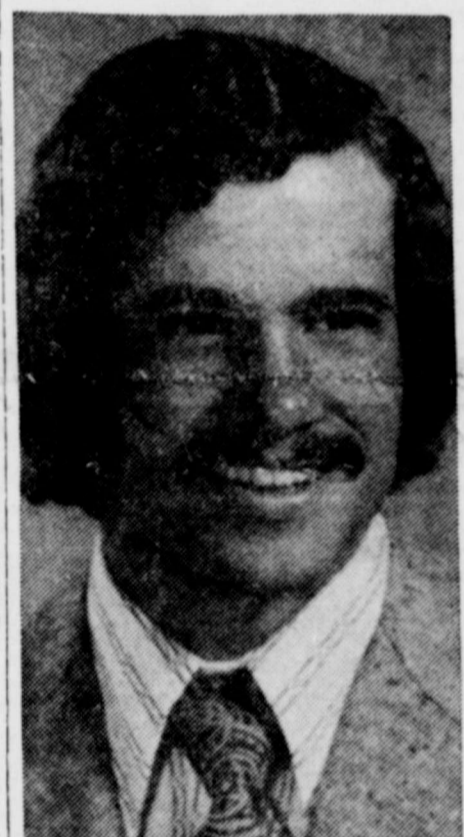
Susan Wallace was chosen as head cheerleader. Others elected were Poca Ford, Sheri Baker, Linda Foust, and Becky Clark.

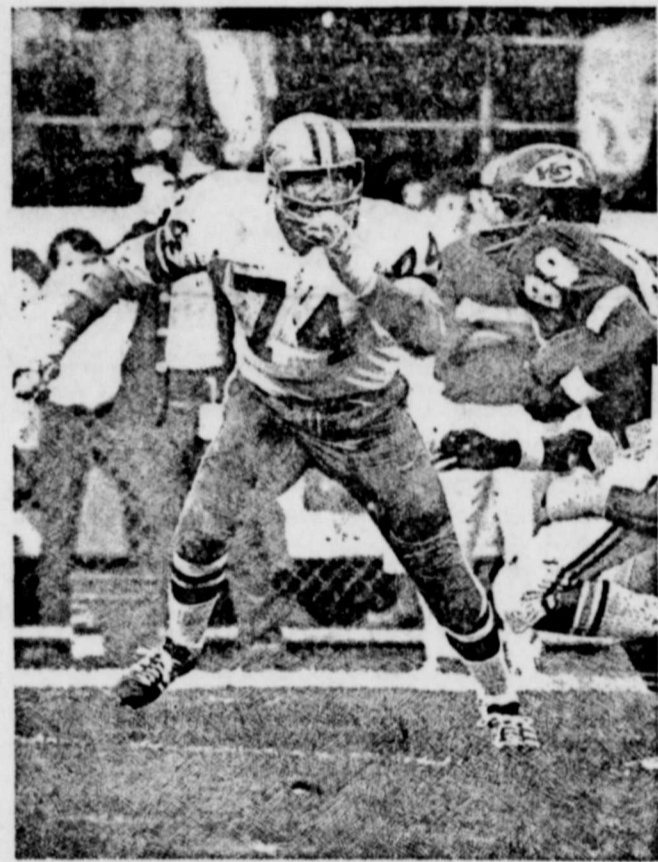

### Entertain at Tea

One of the nicest ways to visit with old friends or to introduce a new neighbor is still an old style tea or coffee "Klatch." For refreshments, offer a choice. Bake or buy your favorite fruit and nut bread and feature one special cake. This sponge cake, filled with jelly and dusted with confectioners sugar, is a typical English tea cake.

#### English Tea Cake

1½ cups sifted flour	2 eggs, separated
¾ cup sugar	½ cup corn oil
¾ cup corn starch	½ cup water
2 teaspoons baking powder	¼ cup jam or jelly
½ teaspoon salt	Confectioners sugar

Grease 2 (8 x 1½-inch) layer cake pans; line with waxed paper. Sift together into a mixing bowl, flour, sugar, corn starch, baking powder and salt. In another bowl, beat together lightly with a fork, egg yolks, corn oil and water. Stir into dry ingredients. Beat egg whites until stiff peaks form when beater is raised. Fold into flour mixture. Pour into prepared pans. Bake in 375°F. oven 25 to 30 minutes or until top springs back when lightly touched with finger. Remove from pans. Cool. Sandwich layers together with jam or jelly and dust with confectioners sugar.

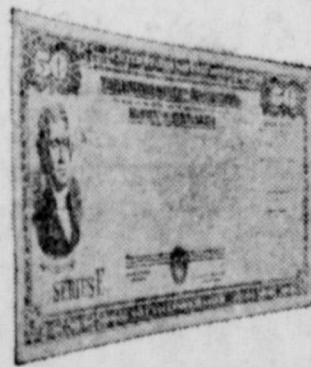

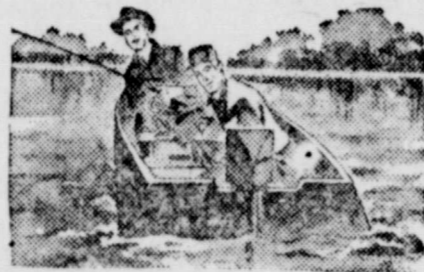






**BIG STRIPER** — Striped bass like this 8 1/4 pound beauty shown here by Hank Baker of Robert Lee.

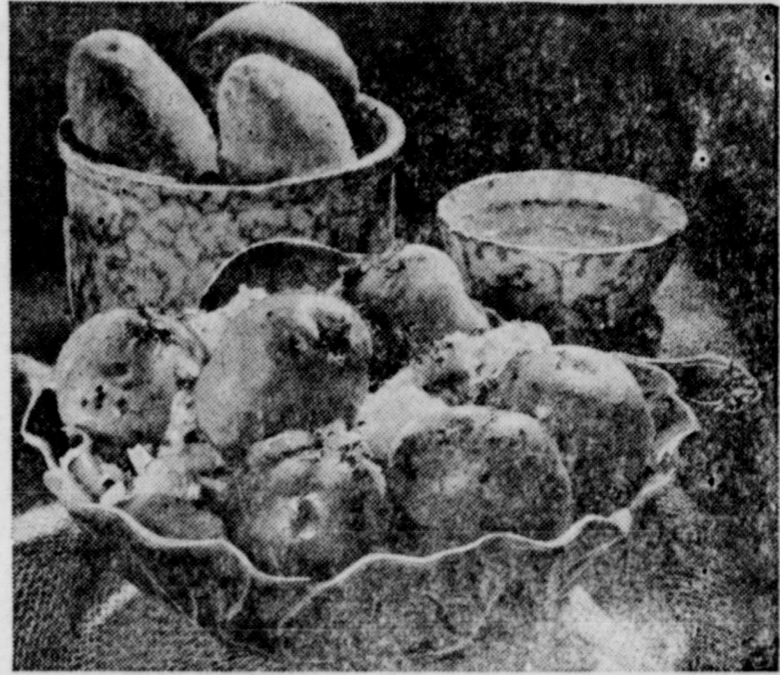

In large heavy Dutch oven with tight-fitting lid, in one inch water, cook potatoes and carrots, covered, 30 minutes or until fork tender. Meanwhile, prepare a "steaming basket" so that cabbage can steam without flavor transfer: with sharp knife, cut about 10 slits in a piece of aluminum foil cut large enough to cover potatoes and carrots. About 10 minutes before potatoes and carrots are done, place foil tray over vegetables in Dutch oven; add cabbage shreds. Cook until cabbage is tender-crisp and potatoes and carrots are tender.

Remove vegetables with slotted spoon and arrange on serving platter; sprinkle with salt and pepper; cover to keep warm. To remaining liquid in Dutch oven, add enough water to make 1 1/2 cups. Bring to a boil. Add bouillon cubes, stirring to dissolve. Stir in remaining ingredients. Pour some of the hot "butter" sauce over vegetables before serving. Pass remaining sauce in a gravy boat.

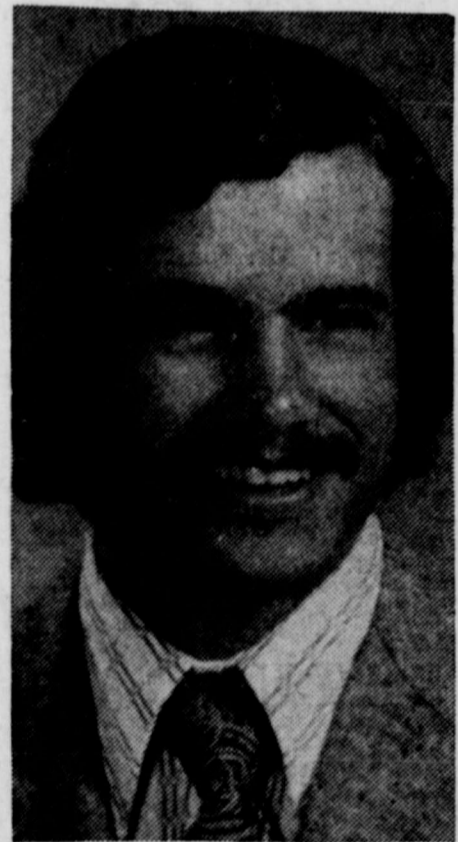

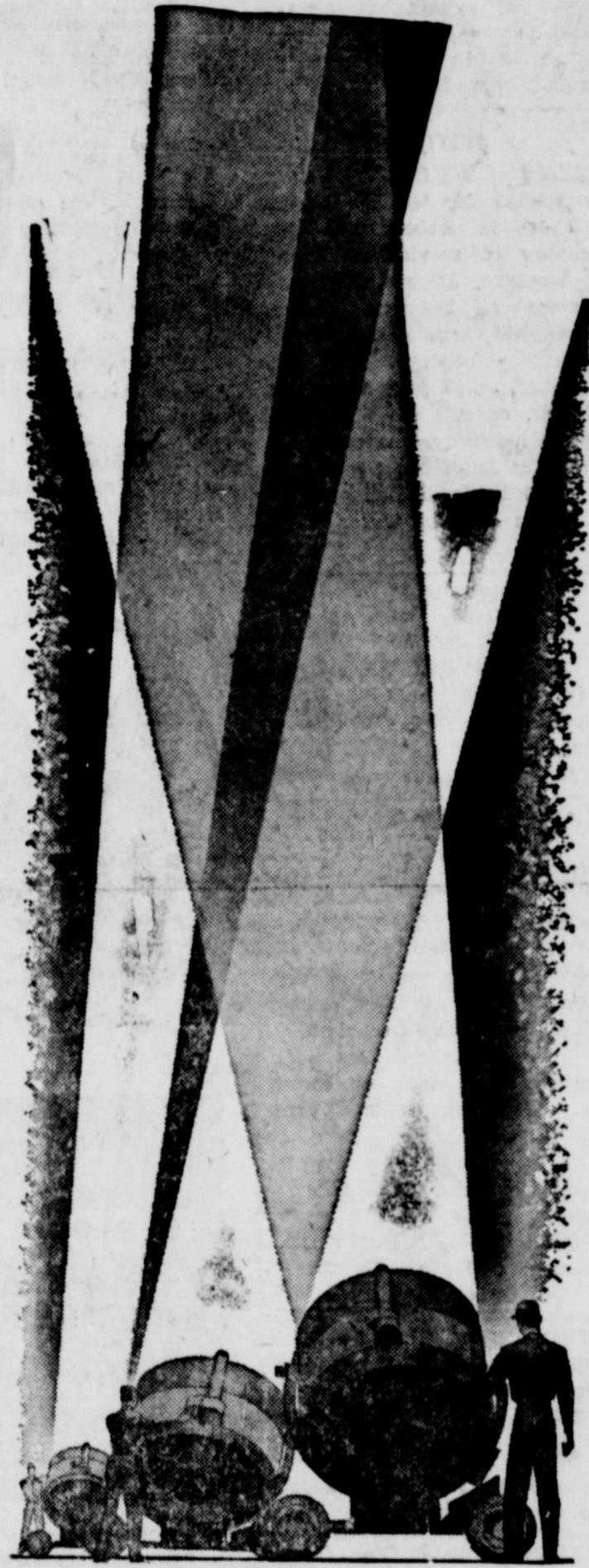
