

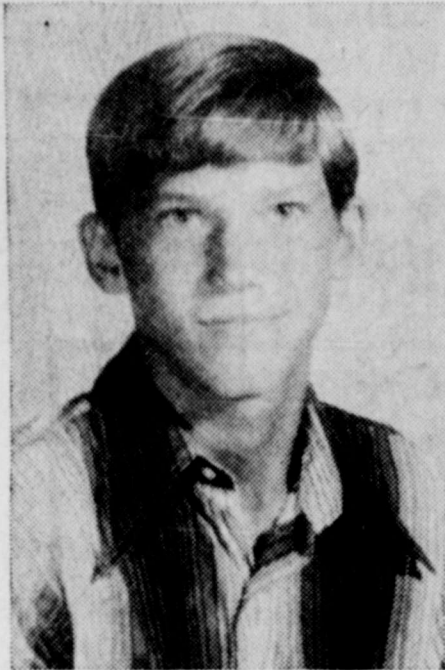

### Rites in Bronte For C. Ditmore

Claude Ditmore, 79, long time Coke County commissioner and retired stock farmer, died Thursday of last week in Bronte Hospital. He had been hospitalized for 11 days.

Funeral services were held Saturday at 2 p.m. in First United Methodist Church where he was a member. The pastor, the Rev. Russel Heaner, conducted the services, assisted by Kenneth Green, Church of Christ minister of Robert Lee. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery under direction of Newby Funeral Home.

Mr. Ditmore was born April 13, 1894, in Tom Green County. He moved to Coke County in 1939 and was engaged in stock farming. He was elected commissioner from precinct four and served in that capacity 14 years. He was a member and past Worshipful Master of Bronte Masonic Lodge and was past Worth Patron of Norton Eastern Star Chapter, but was a member of Bronte Chapter of the Eastern Star at the time of his death. He was a veteran of World War I.

Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Pearl Schooley Ditmore of Bronte; one daughter, Mrs. Elton McGinnis of Eldorado; two sons, Raymond Ditmore of Abilene and Douglas Ditmore of Robert Lee; three step-daughters, Mrs. D. W. Sheffy of San Angelo, Mrs. Turney Casey of Robert Lee and Mrs. Dean Taylor of Springtown; one step-son, Cecil Schooley of Brownwood; 20 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren. Grandsons were pallbearers.

Mrs. Lanier was born Sept. 20, 1880, in Alma, Ark., and was married to Bob Lanier Aug. 3, 1898, in Blum. They moved to Rannels County in 1901, to Decker in 1904 and to Blackwell in 1936. They celebrated their 75th wedding anniversary on Aug. 5 and Mr. Lanier died Aug. 23.

Mrs. Lanier was a long time member of the Rebekah Lodge and the Methodist Church.

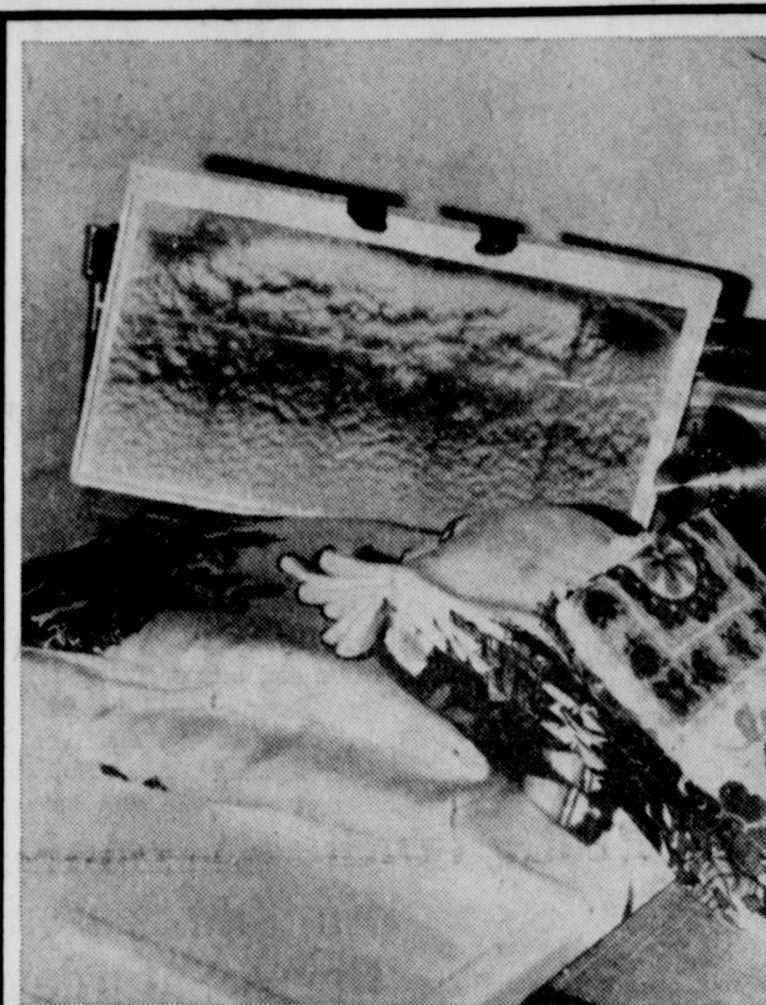

day, 36 in possession.  
 Open season on turkey is Nov. 17 to Jan. 1. Bag limit is two turkeys of either sex.  
 Anyone leasing land for hunting must obtain a shooting preserve license which may be obtained from Parks and Wildlife Department, P. O. Drawer 1590, San Angelo, Tex. 76901, or from a regional office. The fee is \$25.00.

Anyone needing a trapper's license may also obtain it from the Parks and Wildlife Dept. in San Angelo.

All other licenses may be obtained from local license deputies. Duck season for this area is Nov. 10 through Nov. 25 and Dec. 8 through Jan. 20, 1974.

The daily bag limit is reached when the point value of any bird or birds taken reaches or exceeds 100 points. Possession limit is the maximum number of ducks which could have been taken legally in two days.

Daily duck bag limit: one to 10 ducks in the aggregate based on the following 100-plus system:

- 100 point ducks: canvasbacks and redhead ducks.
  - 70 point ducks: mallard hens, wood ducks and hooded mergansers.
  - 10 point ducks: blue winged teal, cinnamon teal, widgeons, scaups and mergansers except hooded.
  - 20 point ducks: all other legal species of ducks.
- The season is closed on black bellied and fulvous tree ducks and New Mexican ducks.

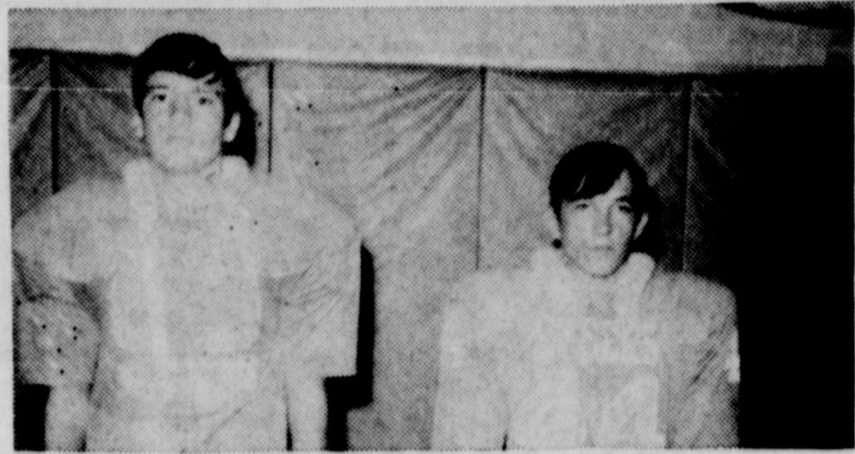

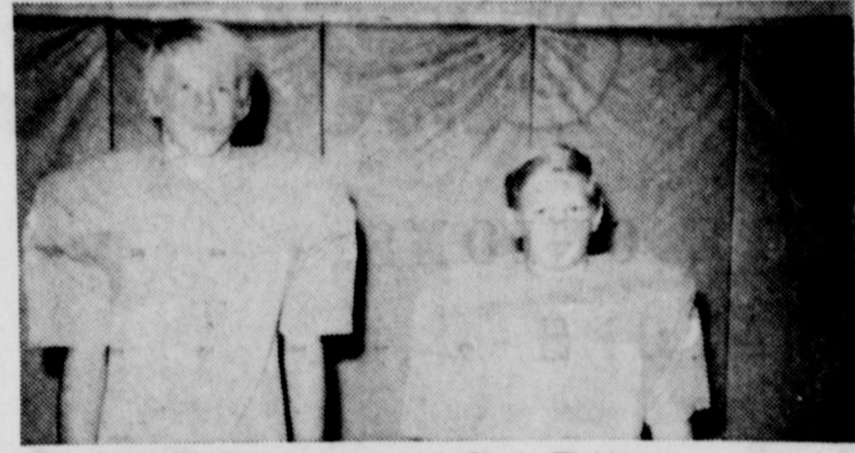
