Funeral services for Bille Loyd Eckert, 68, of Goldthwaite were held last Thursday in Wilkins Funeral Chapel in Goldthwaite.


Officiating was the Rev. Dan Conley, pastor of the First Baptist Church. Burial was in Goldthwaite Cemetery.
