

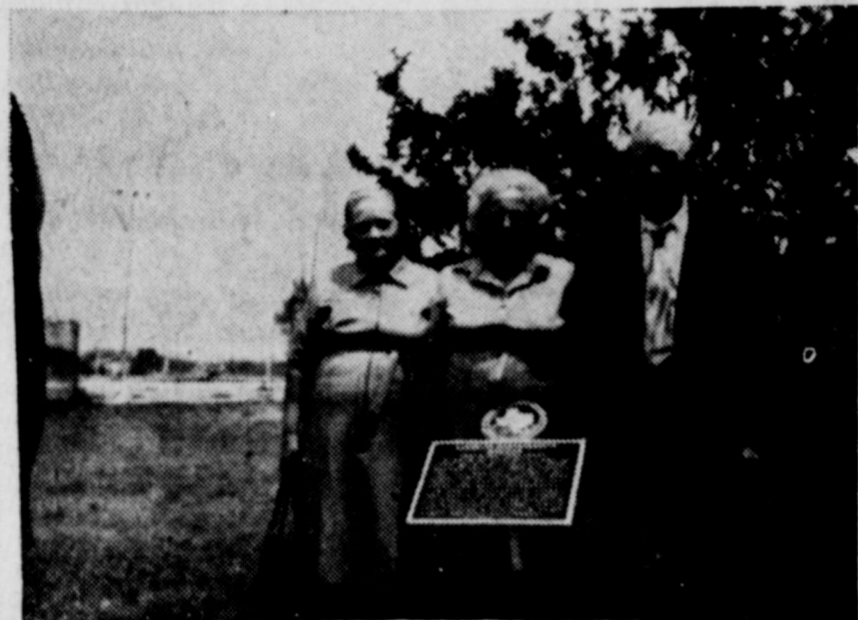

### Marker Dedication, Program Honor Pioneer Coke County Sheriff Murray

Forty persons were present Tuesday for the BCD noon luncheon and the dedication of the Locklin Bartholomew Murray grave marker. The event was held in the Robert Lee Recreation Center with the marker to be erected at the cemetery later.

Murray was an early day Coke County sheriff and tax collector, being elected in 1894 and serving from 1895 until 1903. He was named as an outstanding lawman by Ira A. Bird and the late Hawley Allen and others.

Following the meal, BCD president S. E. Adams welcomed everyone and then turned the program to Sterling Lindsey who was master of ceremonies for the dedication program.

Rev. A. A. Kendall gave the invocation. The colors were presented by Boy Scouts Kevin Roe and Billy Mitlock as Mrs. Wilton Bryan played the National Anthem at the piano. Scout Waid Davis led the audience in the pledge of allegiance and Mrs. C. E. Arrott led "America."

Mrs. Bryan Yarbrough introduced members of the Historical Survey Committee that were present. Among special guests were Wm. L. (Bill) Barnett of Robert Lee, grandson of Mr. Murray; Mr. and Mrs. Bill Calvert of Robert Lee and Mrs. O. D. (Verna) Calvert of Ballinger, the ladies being granddaughters of Mr. Murray; a great-granddaughter, Mrs. Melvin

Allison of Odessa and two great-grandchildren, Randy and Loye Dawn Allison of Odessa.

A special thanks was given to G. C. Allen for his donation toward purchasing the marker.

Ulmer Bird, in giving reflections of Sheriff Murray, cited him as a man who valued the law, had the knack, ability and determination to enforce it, yet had a deep understanding of the people.

Judge Thetford introduced the guest speaker, Highway Patrolman Bobby Haat, who spoke on some of the problems of present day law enforcement.

Mrs. Yarbrough asked that all present pause and give reverence to all lawmen of the past and present time.

Mrs. Bill Calvert, Mrs. Verna Calvert and Bill Barnett unveiled the marker and Sterling Lindsey read the inscription on it.

The song, "Battle Hymn of the Republic," was led by Fern Havins.

Since the United States Senate passed a resolution proclaiming Tuesday as a National Day of Prayer, in observance of the occasion, Ulmer Bird directed a special prayer followed by singing of "God Bless America," led by Mrs. Yarbrough with Mrs. Bryan at the piano.

Kenneth Green, minister of the Northside Church of Christ, gave the benediction.

### Pipeline Contract To Odessa Firm

The contract to construct a water line from Lake Spence to the Robert Lee water treatment plant has been awarded to Key Enterprises of Odessa. The low bid on the 10 inch water line was \$97,000 while the price on the 14 inch line was \$134,500.

The contract will be for the 14 inch line, with the Upper Colorado River Authority paying the difference between the 10 inch and the 14 inch line.

Construction is to be completed within 150 days from the date of signing the contract.

Five bids were received on the project.

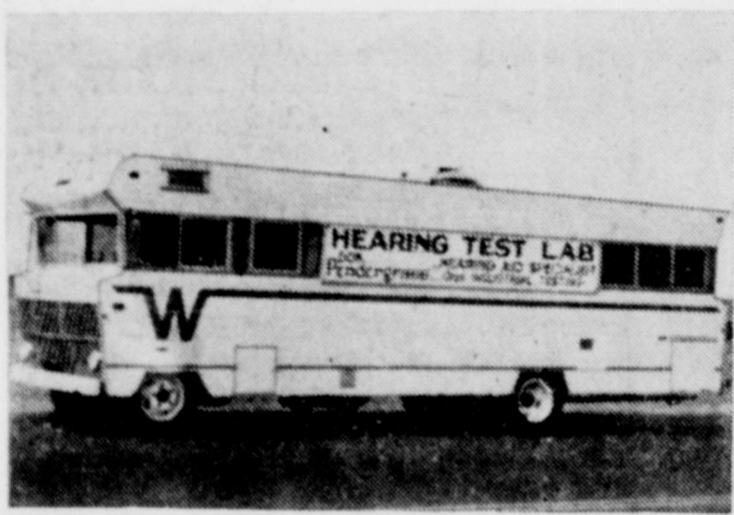

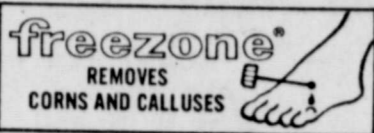

In the race for state representative, District 63, are C. Glenn Toombs of Fluvanna, Michael H. Ezzell of Snyder and Mary Thomas of Big Spring. Renell Rossos presently holds this office.

Dolph Briscoe is seeking reelection as governor and is opposed by Frances "Sissy" Farenthoid, W. H. "Bill" Posey and Steve S. Alexander.

Going after comptroller of public accounts are Hugh Edburg and Bob Bullock.

For treasurer, Jesse James is opposed by Donald B. Yarbrough.

John C. White is opposed by Herbert A. "Peanut" Schroeder for commissioner of agriculture.

Mack Wallace and C. A. Kelly are seeking the office of railroad commissioner.

Tom R. Parrett of San Angelo and Jimmy L. Elrod, San Antonio, are seeking a place on the State Board of Education from District 21.

State Sen. W. E. "Pete" Snelson is running unopposed, as are Bill Hobby for lieutenant governor; John Hill for attorney general; Bob Armstrong for land commissioner; and Jim C. Langdon for railroad commissioner. All candidates for high court positions, on which Coke County votes, are unopposed.
