### Walker Family Reunion Held at Park

A large crowd was present Sunday for the annual Walker reunion, as descendants of the late Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Walker, pioneers of Silver, gathered at the Robert Lee Recreation Hall. There were 105 relatives and friends attending.

The late Mr. and Mrs. Walker were married July 4, 1883. They came to Coke County from McCullough County in 1893 and took up ranching near Silver. Mr. Walker died Jan. 29, 1924, and his wife died April 12, 1938.

They had seven children: five sons, Sam, John, Robert, Jack and Dee; and two daughters, Mrs. Otis (Mattie) Jacobs and Mrs. H. L. (Mary) Bloodworth. Mrs. Bloodworth of Silver is the only surviving child. She and her husband were present Sunday.
