Coke County has had four additional cases of screwworms in the past 10 days, bringing the year's total to six cases.

A case was found in a sheep by Graham Fenton on the Arledge Ranch early last week. This was followed by a case reported in a calf by Mike Hollis, just north of Robert Lee.

Two cases came from calves on east of Bronte.

County Extension Agent Sterling Lindsey said conditions have been ideal for a build-up of screwworms.. One case unfound or unattended could bring on a rash of cases unless the weather gets much cooler and soon, he said. "Hopefully, cold weather will stall the screwworm in this larea withadded.
