Conversion Tables for Cane Sugar With the holiday baking season beginning, homeimakers are looking for ways to substitute other weets for expensive cane sugar Honey, molasses or sorghum, corn syrup and cane syrup are
sweetening agents that will work as well as white sugar in baking. Some general guidelines for these substitutions will help and high quality baked goods. * Honey. For one cup of sugar in baking, use one cup honey and reduce liquid one-fourth cup or each cup of honey used. If about half the sugar is re ained in a recipe and honey subsituted for the other half, a beten quality product will resuit. In baking, use one-fourth te poon soda for each cup of honey. This is in addition to baking powder in the recipe when noney is substituted for sugar.

* Mollasses or sorghum. For ne cup sugar, use one and one up molasses or sorghum and re luce liquid one-fourth cup for each cup
used.

* Corn syrup. For one cup of sugar, use two cups corn syrup for rach er of for each cup of corn syrup used. half cups of cane syrup is equal halif cups of cane syrup is equal in swe
sugar.

sugar with syrup, measure for measure, and reduce liquid onethird. Cakes and cookies made with corn and cane syrups are not as sweet as when sugar is used.
