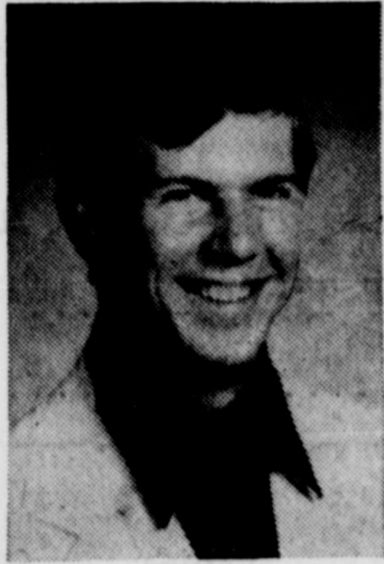

## Career Day to Be Held Next Monday

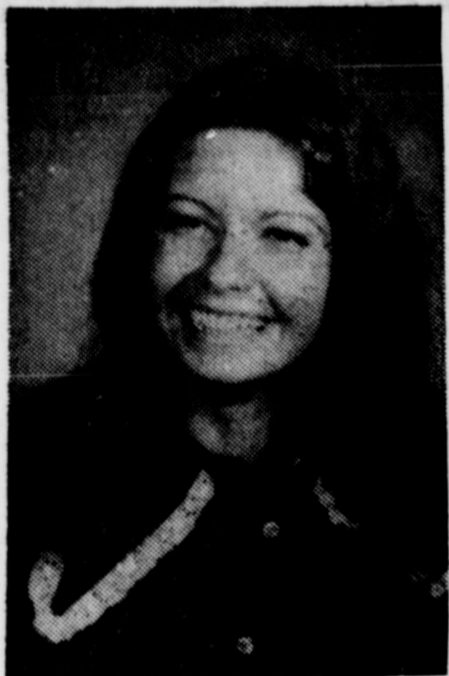

## Vet Coming Friday To Vaccinate Pets

Coke County 4-H Clubs will have a licensed veterinarian in the county Friday, April 18, to vaccinate pets for rabies.

Dr. Paul Hudman of San Angelo will be in Robert Lee at the show barn and recreation Hall Friday from 9 to 10 a.m. and will be at the county park in Bronte from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m.

Dr. Hudman will be prepared to vaccinate pets to prevent other diseases if the shots are requested.

The rabies inoculation will cost \$4.00 per pet.

## Amendment Vote Set for Tuesday

An election to vote on two amendments to the Texas Constitution will be held Tuesday, April 22.

First on the ballot is an amendment which would provide for some changes in the retirement system for state employees, teachers, county and municipal employees. It will add to the state's contribution to the retirement of all these persons, to be taken from tax money.

No. 2 on the ballot provides for an increase in pay of state legislators to \$600 per month, increase their per diem to \$30 per day while the legislature is in session and allow an increase in mileage allowance.

Only four polling places will be open in Coke County: Precinct 1 voters at the Robert Lee Recreation Hall; Precinct 2 at Bronte city hall; Precinct 3 at the county courthouse; and Precinct 4 at the Santa Fe depot in Bronte. Green Mountain voters will cast their ballots at the court house.

Absentee voting will continue through April 18. County Clerk Mrs. Winnie Waldrop told the Observer there had been no absentee votes cast up to 5 p.m. Tuesday.

**Harmon FB Delegate To Washington Meet**

Finis Harmon, vice president and membership chairman of the Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau, will attend the Texas Farm Bureau Presidents' Conference April 22-24 in Washington, D. C.

In order to send a representative, the local Farm Bureau was required to have had 55 per cent of the total new members signed in 1974 and 55 per cent of the total 1974 membership by March 31. In addition, TFB was required to have 85,000 members enrolled and 100 qualified counties by the same date.

Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau qualified with 39 new members and a total membership of 179. Coke-Sterling FB contributed the required fee of \$50 to the cost of the trip for Harmon.

The two day trip is designed as a practical object lesson in federal government operations. According to Carrol Chaloupka, TFB president, county leaders can gain a better understanding of how Congress works and enable Farm Bureau leaders to get to know members of the Texas Congressional delegation.

Dr. Weathers is the son of Mrs. Mary Lou Salvato of San Angelo and is a grandson of Mrs. Daisy McCutchen of Robert Lee and is a nephew of Gordon McCutchen of Robert Lee and Joe (Binks) McCutchen of Bronte.

He has written numerous articles and pamphlets on the dangers of smoking.

Dr. Weathers has a Ph. D. degree in medical research and has completed two years of study in medical school in preparation for becoming a physician. His wife, Donna, will receive a degree in nursing in August.

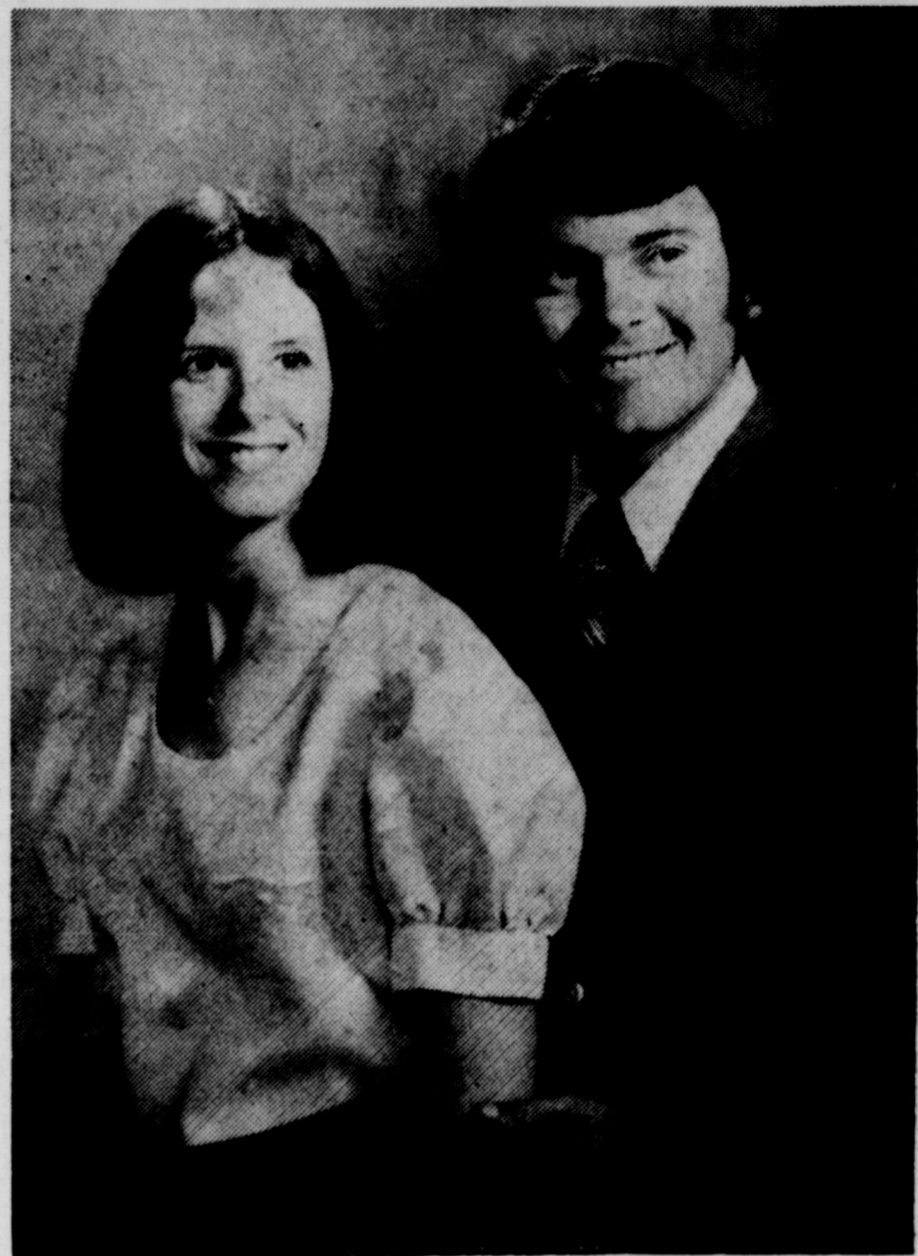
