

The 54 original paintings chosen for the seals have become the properts of the American Lung Association and will hang in a special exhibition in the National Collection of Fine Arts in Washngton, D. C., from Nov. 14, 1975, through Jan-4, 1976.

Mrs. Luckett said this week, "I was glad to see something like this children's art project done with the seals. We were the first voluntary health association in this country, and we've always been interested in healthy lungs for people, particularly children. We've always been involved in school health; this is the place to develop good health habits.

"Our main work is in education, educating the public and professionals. Since our goal is the control and prevention of lung disease, I think it is also important that we are involved in programs to get rid of the causes such as smoking and air pollution.

"Of the funds raised through the Christmas Seai campaign, 90 per cent remains in Texas. The other 10 per cent supports the national organization with a sizeable portion of that earmarked for medical research and training.

"No outside professional fund raisers are involved in the drive and all donations are tax exempt inder IRS rulings.
