What is the difference between term and permanent insurance?

Term insurance is protection for a certain (limited) period of time which usually may be renewed for another period of time or converted to permanent insurance . . . . provided you and your agent arranged for this privilege when you bought the policy. Permanent insurance will last as long as you want it and will accumulate cash value and paid-up values .... which may later be used as cash or collateral. Term insurance costs less in premium but the policy will expire after its term ... unless renewed. Since term insurance does not accumulate cash value or paid-up values, many feel, while cheaper in the short run, it is more expensive in the long run and when possible provisions should be made to convert it to permanent insurance.


