Hayrick Rites for Mack Eubanks

Mack Anderson Eubanks, 63, long time resident of Bronte, died Sunday of an apparent heart attack. Mr. Eubanks was found dead on the Royce Fancher place south of town where he had gone to run traps he had set out on the place.

Justice of the Peace Cecil Kemp ruled that death was from an apparent heart attack and probably occurred at approximately 2 p.m.

A son, George Eubanks, and Manuel Reyes went in search for Mr. Eubanks after he failed to return home from the Fancher ranch where he had gone earlier in the day.

Graveside services were held at 3 p.m. Tuesday in Hayrick Cemetery. Bob Adams, minister of the Bronte Church of Christ, officiated.

Mr. Eubanks was born Nov. 30, 1912, in San Saba and came to Coke County with his parents at an early age. He lived in Hayrick and Bronte most of his life. He was married to Hazel Lowrance in Robert Lee in 1935.

Survivors include his wife; three sons, George Eubanks of Bronte, Bill Eubanks of Dallas and Ray Eubanks of Del Rio; one sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Crisp of Midland; one brother, Ellis Eubanks of San Angelo and formerly of Robert Lee; and five grandchildren.

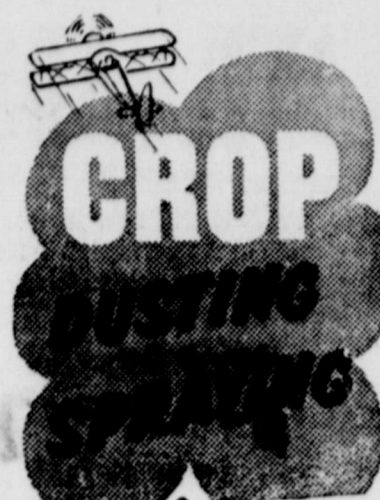
