## Snelson to Speak at Democratic Rally Planned Saturday In Robert Lee Community Banquet

A Community Banquet, sponsored by the Robert Lee-Silver Lions Club, the '64 Study Club and the Bicentennial Committee, will be held at 7 p.m. April 23, in the Robert Lee School Cafeteria with State Senator W. E. (Pete) Snelson featured as the guest speaker.

Senator Snelson lives in Midland and is presently serving his fourth term as a member of the Texas Senate, where he ranks seventh in seniority. He represents the 25th Senatorial District which includes 35 counties and 59,599 square miles and is the largest senate district in the nation. It is also larger than 30 individual states in the nation.

Elected to the Texas House of Representatives in 1960 and first elected to the Texas Senate in 1964, he was again elected to the Senate in 1968, 1972 and 1974.

He serves as Chairman of the Intergovernmental Relations Committee and is a member of the Finance

and Education committees. In addition, he is a member of the Legislative Budget Board, which recommends appropriations of funds for the operation of all state facilities.

The Senator is Secretary-Treasurer and a member of the Executive Committee of the Southern Regional Education Board which administers a 14-state compact. Also he is vice chairman of its Legislative Advisory Council. He is also serving on the Reapportionment Committee of the National Legislative Conference.

Since becoming a member of the Texas Legislature, Senator Snelson has specialized in the field of education. He is one of the few members who has had experience in teaching or administration in high school, junior college and university levels. In addition to having served on the education committee in both the house and senate, he served on the education committee of the Constitutional Convention.

### CONGRESSMAN VISITS OVER 21ST DISTRICT

Congressman Bob Krueger is spending seven days visiting the cities of his district. This Saturday, April 17, he will first go to Garden City, then to St. Lawrence and then to Sterling City. From Sterling City he will travel to Coke County and speak to citizens and voters at the Robert Lee County Park.

He will also visit the West Coke County Hospital and Nursing Home about 4 p.m. At 4:30 he will be picked up by plane at the Robert Lee airstrip.

Congressman Krueger has a difficult time visiting with all the people in his district, as it stretches from east of San Antonio to the Big Ben country.

### RURAL WATER PROJECT MAKING PROGRESS

The Coke County Water Supply Corporation interim board of directors met on April 12. Members Don Fields, Fred McCabe Jr., Floyd Harmon and Bobby Roberts, along with County Judge W. W. Theford and Extension Agent Sterling Lindsey met with engineer William Fox.

The board canvassed the applications for rural water meters and 170 applications were turned over to the engineer.

The next step will be for the engineer to plot locations of water meters and determine where Phase I of the project should be located.

Applications for water meters will still be accepted. The original 30 day sign up period was for the engineer to determine where the most users were located.

Fox will take this information and begin preliminary studies to determine where Phase I should be located.

### Glenn Honored As Conservationist

E. F. Glenn of Bronte has been selected as conservationist of the year for 1975 by directors of the Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District. He was recognized at a recent meeting of the Bronte Noon Lions Club for his work in conservation of soil and water on the places he operates in East Coke County.

Royce Fancher explained the work that had been done by Glenn and explained the importance of management in applying a conservation program.

He then presented Glenn a plaque on behalf of the Lions Club and the Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District.

Glenn has been a cooperater with the district since 1949. Since that time, according to Soil and Water District officials, he has done an excellent job of controlling mesquite by rootplowing and of improving forage production by reseeding. Grasses such as Kleingrass, sideoats grama and K. R. bluestem have been planted.

Management practices are the most effective part of maintaining an effective conservation program. Some of these important practices consist of proper grazing use, deferred grazing, conservation cropping system, crop residue use, and contour farming.

Practices such as fencing, diversions, maintaining terraces, and pond construction for livestock water have also been carried out to complete the conservation program.

In addition to his ranching operations, Glenn also serves as president of the First National Bank in Bronte.

### Services Here for Miss Ollie Green

Services for Martha Ollie Green, 92, were held at 4 p.m. Thursday, April 8, in the Robert Lee Baptist Church.

She died at 2:35 p.m. Wednesday at West Coke County Nursing Home where she had lived the past five years.

The Rev. Roy Epperson, pastor of the Robert Lee Baptist Church, officiated, assisted by John Gross, minister of the Southside Church of Christ. Burial was in Robert Lee Cemetery, directed by Newby Funeral Home. Weldon Fikes, Melvin Childress, Vaughan Davis, Bill Allen, Gerald Allen and Sam Williams served as pallbearers.

"Miss Ollie," as she was called by her many friends, was born June 5, 1883, at Fate, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. A. (Mary Lowry) Green. She came to Coke County when a young girl and had lived here except for about 10 years she spent in Dallas. Before moving to West Coke County Nursing Home in April, 1971, she resided six years with a nephew and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Swofford, who were living in Dallas and then moved to Temple. She had previously spent a few years with the Swoffords because of her ill health but returned to Robert Lee for several years before residing with them the second time.

Miss Green was one of Robert Lee's and Coke County's oldest pioneers. She was a charter member of the local chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star and a charter member of the Robert Lee Baptist Church and, before her death, was the only living member who helped organize the two organizations. She served as church clerk and organist for the Robert Lee Baptist Church for several years and was a retired music teacher.

Even though she had been totally blind for the past 10 years, she maintained an active life as long as her health permitted. In spite of her blindness, she continued to crochet and do other handwork.

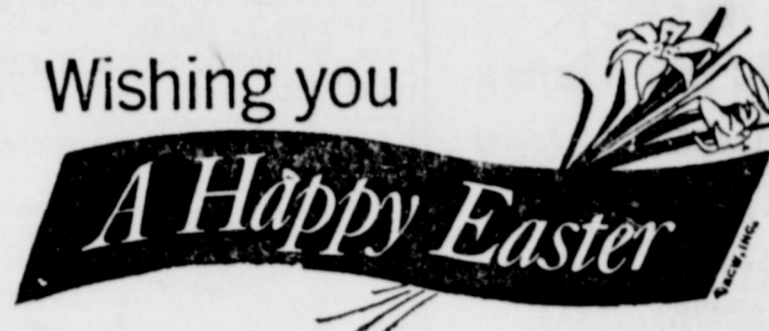

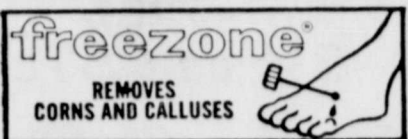

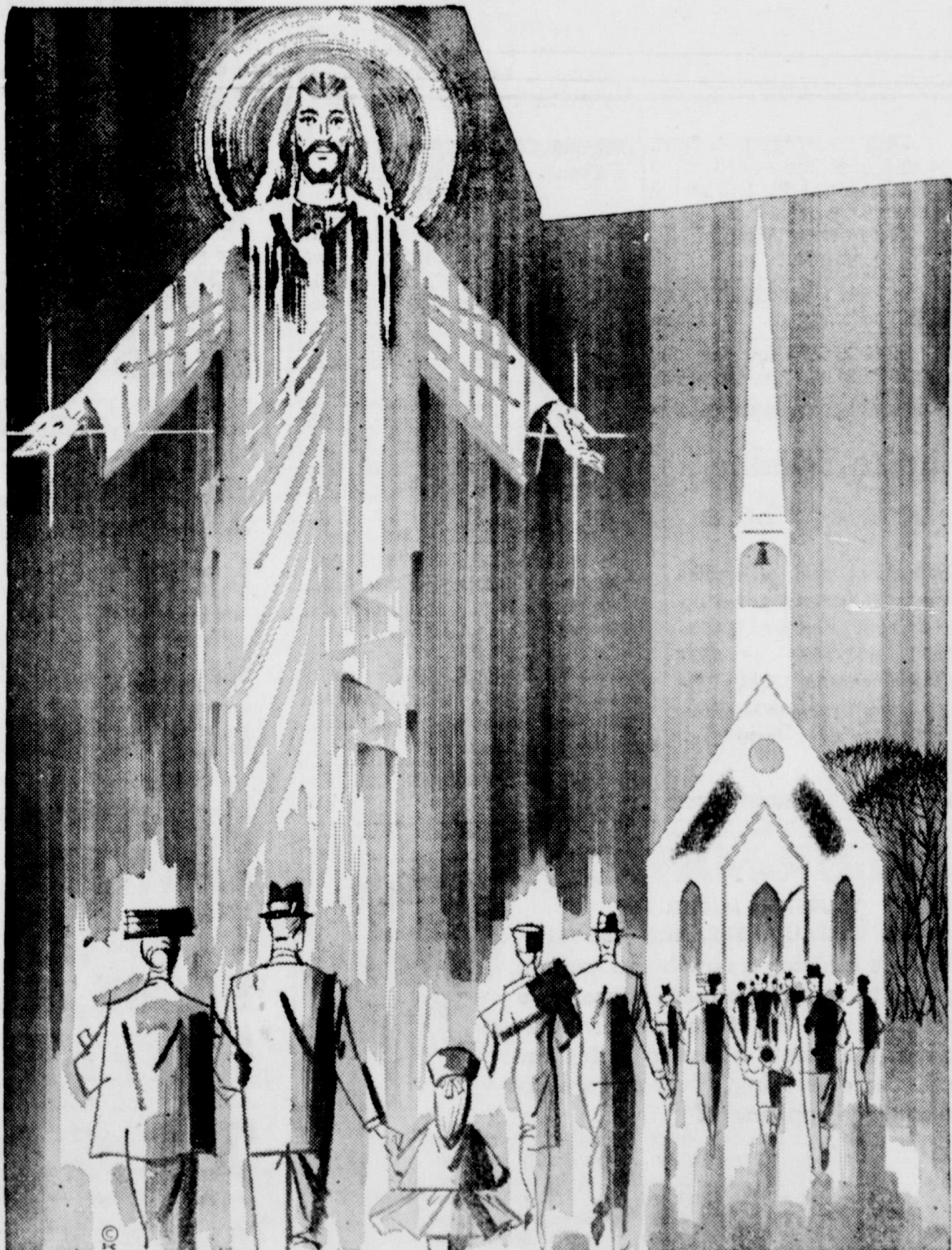
