#### FOURTH 1976 CASE SCREWWORMS TOLD

Coke County sustained its fourth case of screwworms in 1976 last week in a case submitted by T. E. Pitcock. Pitcock was able to collect only one worm from a wound in a cow's flank. The larvae was confirmed as being a screwworm rather than one of the flesh eating maggots.

Three cases were registered earlier in the year, two coming from near Blackwell, one from west of Water Valley. Four weeks passed before the fourth case was submitted by Pitcock from his place near Sanco. To combat the dreaded insect, male sterile screwworm flies will be dropped on the area from name by Jessie N. Yarbrough. where the sample or ginated. Hopeefully, no larvae from the wound day nights, are the planned dates worth. will complete their life cycle and of the presentation in Robert Lee emerge to deposit egg masses on High School Auditorium. another animal wound.

All operators are encouraged to check their livestock and treat all wounds. If a suspected case is found a sample of the larvae should as well as personnel for ticket sales. be submitted to the Mission Laboratory for confirmation. Sterile fly drops are made only where confirmed cases are found in this portion of the state.





What is the maximum amount a person can put aside in an Individual Retirement Account? Are there any restrictions to who



Each year, maximum contribution is 15% of your annual earned income or \$1,500, whichever is less. However, there is no ceiling on the amount you may accumulate . . . only limitation by the number of years you contribute until normal retirement age. These yearly contributions to IRA are deducted from your adjusted gross income during the accumulation period. Contributions must be paid into IRA during the respective fiscal year. To be eligible you must receive compensation from an employer or from self-employment. You may not be covered by another IRS approved retirement pension or profit-sharing plan. IRA funds may be invested in quality, sound properties such as retirement income life insurance and endowment plans.




