## MORE SCREWORMS IN COKE COUNTY

Coke County screwworm cases numbers six and seven cropped up last week.

These follow closely on the heels of the fifth case found some 10 days ago north of Bronte. The area total for the year has jumped dramatically during the past couple of weeks. Coke County Agent Sterling Lindsey said, "Hopefully, sterile fly drops along with the hot dry weather will hold the flesh eaters in check until this fall."

The latest Coke County cases came from the Arledge Ranch, 16 miles north-northwest of Robert Lee and from an unknown individual six miles southwest of Black-who apparently forgot to sign the information sheet.

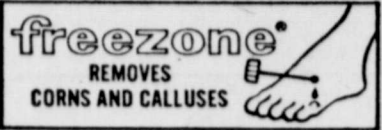
