SCREWWORM CASES INCREASE IN COKE

Screwworm cases in Coke County increased sharply this past week with nine cases recorded. Sixteen of the yearly total for the county have been recorded during the past three weeks.

The new cases were scattered in several areas over the county. North of Bronte cases were found on the Bill McDonald Ranch and the Lee Ranch Co. In the Silver area, Myrle Jameson, Raymond Bloodworth, Clayton Bloodworth and Foster Sims Price had confirmed cases. To the west, Vida Peays reported a case, as did Frank Demere Jr. near Water Valley. On the south side of the county, Clyde Bowen reported one case. The ninth case came from north of Sanco on the Arledge Ranch, their fourth case of the year.
