To the Citlzens, Taxpayers and Commercial Organizations in the Various Counties and Communities of New Mexico:

Upon the initiative of members of the Commercial Club in the City of Albuquerque a mass meeting of citizens and taxpayers, irrespective of politics was called to meet at the Club Building on the firstinstant, for the purpose of considering and expressing their views as taxpayers, upon the proposed county salaries bills, now pending before the legeislature.

The meeting was a large and representative one composed of leading business men and citizens of Bernalillo County, including several of the county officers whose salaries were in question.

The attention of the members present was called to the existing condition whereby it is threatened and probable that the revenues for the coming year will be insufficient to carry on the business of the new State and that a bond issue will be necessary to provide for the ordinary expenses.


