### Parcels Post Rates

January 1st, 1913, the operation of the parcels post will begin. It will require special parcels post stamps to secure the benefits of this new law. These will be sold by the local post

The rates will vary according to distance, and we give below a few of the extreme charges, both minimum and maximum:

The distance is divided into zones, the local zone covering 50 miles from your post office, and the chargea will be from 5 to 15 cents for eleven pounds, and intermediate weights being between those extremes. The one pounder rate will vary from 5 cents at your local office to 12 cents for a distance of 1800 miles or over, each zone being about one cent per pound more or less than the one next to it, and the distance for a zone being from 150 miles to 600 miles, the farther you send it the greater milerge to the zone haul. The rates of postage are greatly reduced and the application of the law will mean a saying of millions of dollars per annum to patrons of the post office. The highest charge enumerated is \$1. 32 for carrying an eleven eleven pound parcel 1800 miles or more, Parcels must not be more than 72 inches in length and girth, must not contain anything that might injure any employee of the service, must not be easily destroyed, or






