The otal quanity of cheese made in Holland in 1910 was 84,000 tons. t was expofted largely to Eng land, Germany, and Belgiom the United States also taking con siderable. The estabilishment country did much to help the cause along.
Now you very readily see what the Dutch farmer who has ive country in order to sell them can depend on for his work. I you will figure out the above figures you will see that the 77 farmers owned an average of about twenty one cows apiece and sold to this milk station over eighteen hundred dollars worth year. Now think of the same thing happening bere. If one hundred farmers here were walking around with a thonsand dollars in the bank to their credit what difference there would be in the business of the town and in the feelings of the coinmunity at large.
