### How to raise a crook

by Jim Davidson

While it should go without saying, most of us parents love our children and we want the very best futures for them and want them to become productive, responsible, law abiding However, citizens. apparently a lot of parents do not realize that their own attitudes and behavior contribute to the real possibility of one or more of their children winding up in prison. Along these lines I want to share something titled HOW TO RAISE A CROOK, printed some time ago in The Presbyterian Journal. I hope if you are a parent or someone who is in a position to influence the values, morals and character of young people, you may benefit from it. If you'll think about it, much of what we learn comes from the experience of others and it can be for bad or for good.

1. Begin from infancy to give the child everything he wants; this way he will grow up to believe the world owes him a living.

2. When he picks up bad words, laugh at him -- it will encourage him to pick up "cuter" phrases that will blow the top of your head off later.

3. Never give him any spiritual training. Wait until he is twenty-one and then let him decide for himself.

4. Avoid the use of the word "wrong." He may develop a guilt complex. This will condition him to believe later, when he is arrested for stealing a car, that society is against him and that he is being persecuted.

5. Pick up anything he leaves lying around: books, clothing. shoes, Do everything for him so he will be experienced in throwing the responsibility onto others.

6. Let him read any printed matter he can get his hands on. Be careful the silverware and drinking glasses are sterilized, but let his mind feed on garbage.

7. Quarrel frequently in the presence of children, then they won't be too shocked when the home is broken up.

8. Give the child all the spending money he wants. Never let him earn his own. Why should he have things as tough as you have had them?

9. Satisfy his every need for food, drink and comfort. Denial may lead to harmful frustrations.

10. Take his part against the neighbors, teachers and policemen. They are all prejudiced against your child.

11. When he gets into real trouble, apologize for yourself by saying, "I never could do anything with him."

Certainly this is a personal thing, but let's hope this article will help us see ourselves in a true light, and it will make a positive difference in our attitudes toward raising our children and grandchildren. Someone once said that "prison" is a school to which criminals are sent to figure out what went wrong." It's no real mystery. When parents are not good role models and fail to teach character values to their children, the results are usually predictable. (EDITOR'S NOTE: Jim Davidson is a motivational speaker and columnist. 



LCP sign-up will begin on April 1 and is scheduledto end early June, 2003. The Act expands LCP by including additional counties that were approved under a Secretarialdisaster designation or Presidential disaster declarationfor damages and losses due to any natural disaster. The Act

also includes catfish as an eligible commodity.

Previously under LCP, a county must have been named as a primary county under a Secretarial disasterdesignation between Jan. 1, 2001, and Sept. 19, 2002, onlyfor drought. The Act expands LCP to make eligible anycounties that were requested as primary disaster areas under a Presidential or Secretarial declaration by Feb.20, 2003, and that were subsequently approved.

To be eligible for LCP assistance, producer'slivestock operation headquarters must be physicallylocated in a county with a qualifying disaster designation. Eligible livestock are cattle, sheep, goats, and buffalo, as well as catfish. Counties named ascontiguous counties are not eligible for the program. LCPpayments will be based on losses per head or number ofeligible livestock and catfish.

To sign up for LCP assistance, eligible producersshould visit their local FSA offices on April 1. USDA anticipates more than 700 additional counties will be madeeligible for LCP under the Act. LCP was originally administered in 2.149 counties. Tobacco Payment Program (TOPP)

Sign-up for TOPP will begin March 17 and is scheduled to end May 16, 2003. The program provides an estimated \$53 million to tobacco producers. Eligible applicants are quota holders and producers of all kinds oftobacco under USDA's 2002 tobacco program. Payments are expected to be issued between mid-May and June 1, 2003. To apply for TOPP assistance, eligible persons should visit their local USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices beginning March 17. Agriculture Assistance Act Provisions

The Act, signed into law on Feb. 20, 2003, authorizes total disaster aid estimated at \$3.1 billion for producers suffering from natural disasters and related conditions. USDA will announce sign-up as quickly possible for other

#### Study shows United States at mid-point on water availability scale

Several years of drought in various regions of the United States cause us to stop and wonder how abundant the nation's and world's water supply really

There will always be the same amount of water on Earth, however, it is not distributed evenly among the countries.

According to research from the United Kingdom, the United States' water availability per capita is fair, when compared to some countries. Yet in other instances, the available water does not come close-especially when compared to Iceland.

The purpose of The Water Poverty Index: International Comparisons,

Peter Lawrence, Jeremy Meigh and Caroline Sullivan of Keele University, and Centre for Ecology and Hydrology in Wallingford, United Kingdom, was to link household welfare with water availability and indicate the degree to which water scarcity impacts human populations.

The main components of the study were water resources, access to water, water capacity, water use, and environment. The researchers obtained information from 147 different countries and compared each of the components. Researchers used the Falkenmark water stress index to determine water avail-ability.

The index measures per a document writ-ten by capita water availability per


year in cubic meters. For example, the United States has 8,900 cubic meters per person available annually. Countries with per capita per year water availability below 500 cubic meters are beyond the "water barrier of manageable capability." Those with 500 to 1,000 cubic meters available per capita have scarce water, and those between

1,000 and 1,600 cubic meters have water stress. Israel, Jordan, Saudi

Arabia and United Arab Emirates ranked the lowest on the Falkenmark index. All four countries only have 100 cubic meters of water available per capita annually.

On the other end of the spectrum, Iceland has 605,000 cubic meters of

water available per capita each year, followed by Suriname with 479,600 cubic meters of water per capita annually. Congo, Gabon, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea all have more than 100,000 cubic meters available annually. The graph above compares a few countries' water availability per capita per year. #### Drip irrigation made easy by knowing properties

Drip irrigation has made it easy for agricultural producers on the High Plains to apply water more effi-ciently. The technology does not allow evaporation, wind drift or tailwater waste. But, unless a drip system is taken care of properly, it can create major problems, plus cost time and money.

Cooperative Extension (TCE), a drip system maintenance program includes cleaning filters, flushing the lines, adding chlorine, and injecting acids. These steps will help keep the emitters from plugging with suspended solids, magnesium and calcium precipitation, manganeseiron oxides and sulfides, algae, bacteria, and plant roots. Many of these precipitates form when fertilizer and other chemicals are added to the water. Even so, major repairs can often be avoided if the system is cared for properly.

system is to know what chemical properties are in the water. Test the water coming out of every well, as water quality can vary, even within a quarter-section of land. Emitters have a severe potential of being plugged when pH levels are above 8.0, iron above 1.5 parts per million, and sulfides above two parts per million. According to Texas Bicarbonates above 100 parts per million carry moderate potential of plugging.

> The TCE publication, Main-taining Subsurface Drip Irrigation Systems said filters are the most important aspect to a drip system's success. A common practice is to install a combination of filters to remove suspended solids in the water.

> However, very fine particles can still pass through filters and clog emitters. Flushing the lines can help prevent emitters from plugging.

A low concentration of chlorine kills bacteria and oxidizes iron. Iron and The first step to caring manganese concentrations for the drip irrigation above certain levels can

promote bacterial growth, which will clog the emitters. Iron bacteria will have a reddish color, while manganese growth will look black. Research is ongoing to address the manganese bacteria problem.

Acids will treat plugging caused by lime and magnesium precipitation. Sulfuric, phosphoric, ureasulfuric or citric acids may be used. TCE recommends injecting the acid after the filter so that it does not corrode it.

Plant roots are another common problem. They can penetrate the drip tape, and at that point, the tape will have to be replaced. Chemicals are available to help control root intrusion.

Remember, every drip system is different, as are the properties of the water. For more information,

#### LEGAL NOTICE

On February 6, 2003, VALOR Telecommunications of Texas, LP (VALOR) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to establish surcharges to recover lost revenues and increased costs associated with seven hundred thirteen (713) Expanded Local Calling Service (ELCS) routes implemented in and between VALOR's Texas telephone exchanges and in many instances, exchanges of other local telephone companies. The application is filed based on the Commission's Substantive Rule 26.221 titled, "Applications to Establish or Increase Expanded Local Calling Service

ELCS expands a local calling scope to include one or more additional telephone exchanges, if customers in a petitioning exchange approve by ballot, the payment of an ELCS fee in lieu of long distance charges. The costs and lost revenues associated with VALOR's surcharge application are those not recoverable through the ELCS fee.

In the application, VALOR proposes to implement on an interim basis a monthly per line surcharge of \$.99 for residential customers and \$1.98 for business customers beginning with the April, 2003 bill cycle. This proposed surcharge will apply in addition to any monthly ELCS fees. If rates at or above the level of the interim surcharges are not ultimately approved by the Commission, VALOR will refund all or part of the interim surcharges, as directed by the Commission. Ultimately, VALOR seeks approval of monthly surcharges of \$3.38 for business lines and \$1.69 for residential lines to replace the interim surcharges. Additionally, the application proposes that customers currently billed ELCS fees lower than \$3.50 per residential line and \$7 per business line, will have those fees raised to \$3.50 per residential line and \$7 per business line.

The net annual effect on the revenues of VALOR will be zero since the requested surcharge replaces lost revenues and reimburses VALOR for the increased cost of service associated with ELCS. The estimated total lost revenues and increased costs VALOR seeks to recover through this proceeding is \$7,601,145 annually.

# "SAVVY SENIOR"

YOU ASK THE SENIOR QUESTION - WE FIND THE SAVVY ANSWER

Dear Savvy Senior,

I am turning 62 in a few months and was thinking about collecting my Social Security retirement benefits early. I know I will be receiving less than if I wait until I'm 65, but since I don't know when I'm going to die, I keep thinking that I would rather collect less money for a longer period of time, than more money for a shorter period of time. What do you think? Now or LaterDear Now,

It's a gamble with good 'ol Uncle Sam! However, before you lay down your bet, be sure to visit your local Social Security office to get the savvy facts.

Social Security has formulas that roughly match your life expectancy with the benefits you get. If you live longer than expected, you get more than the government planned to pay you. But, if die too soon, Uncle Sam wins.

So, when should you start collecting your Social security retirement benefits? You can begin collecting benefits as early as age 62 - before your full retirement age. But if you do, your benefits will be reduced to account for the longer period over which you'll be paid.

You can begin collecting full benefits at age 65 if you were born before 1938. The "full" retirement age has been ratcheted up for everyone else - up to 67 for those born in 1960 or later.

You can forgo collecting benefits up until you turn 70 and thus qualify for "delayed retirement credit." If you do, your eventual monthly benefit will go up by as much as 8

percent for each year beyond your full retirement age that you put off receiving benefits.

So, which choice is best for you?

Although all three options are designed to eventually pay out roughly equal total amounts, six in 10 retirees opt for the early benefits.

Savvy Note: Depending on when you were born, the monthly payments will be 20 to 30 percent lower than the monthly payments you'd receive by waiting until your normal retirement age.

Savvy Example: Say that you''re turning 62 sometime in 2003 and will be eligible, based on your lifetime earnings, for a monthly benefit of \$1,444.

Wait until your full retirement age and the benefit will be \$1,931 a month. Delay the benefits until your 70, and you''ll get \$2,697 a month.

Savvy Reminder: Those who turn 65 in 2003 must wait until two months past their birthday to qualify for full benefits.

Here are a few savvy factors to consider in deciding your payday. Your Health and Life Expectancy: While you can't outlive your Social Security benefits, taking them can change from a smart move to a not-so-smart move if you live long enough. It's a gamble, but if you expect to live long because of good health and family longevity, you may be wise not to take benefits early. Savvy Fact: If you live to age 65 your average life expectancy today for a man is about 81, and for a woman it is 84.

If your spouse was not in the paid labor force, your Social Security benefits could represent the large share of his or her retirement income.

The Power of Money: Don't forget that the money you already have in retirement accounts could keep growing tax deferred if you were living instead on Social Security benefits.

How Long You Want To Keep Working: Work often provides health care coverage and other benefits that can otherwise cost you plenty. If you want to keep working, collecting benefits before you reach full retirement age probably doesn't make sense, especially if you have considerable earnings. That's because your Social Security benefits are reduced if you earn above a ceiling that is adjusted each year. Is Sooner Savvy or Is

Later Better? The Social Security formulas for early, full and delayed benefits are designed to be a wash over your lifetime. But that's based on average life expectancy. About 60 percent choose to take benefits early because the break even point is after age 80. If you don't survive to 80, then it would be a mistake not to take early benefits. Savvy Note: If you plan on living to 100, you're better off waiting. Experts also agree there's almost never any reason to wait to take benefits until you turn 70 unless your spouse needs your benefits to meet living expenses. When you die, your spouse will receive the larger of the two benefits. This savvy information was obtained in part from the Social Security Administration and AARP.

### Goodbye to Saddam Hussein

Yet, rather than simply stating the obvious, they try to argue

their position without having any facts to support it.

At the recent antiwar protests in Washington, DC, a number of the protestors carrying "No War for Oil" signs were asked, "If America just wanted the oil, why didn't we just take it after the first Gulf War?" A popular response was "Gee... I dunno." Another top comeback was "Ummm, errr."

The anti-war contingent claims, that Saddam Hussein is not a threat to other countries. Let's see... this is the same person who has waged war against Iran using chemical weapons; has invaded Kuwait; and has launched Scud missiles at Israel. Come to think of it, let's make Saddam head of the regional Welcome Wagon.

Another claim is that military action against Iraq will increase the likelihood of another terrorist attack against the U.S. OK, good point... let's just sit back and do nothing. Wait, I'm pretty sure that's what we were doing on September 10, 2001.

One of my personal favorites from the likes of Janeane Garofalo and Mike Farrell is that we should just "let the inspectors do their job." Don't they realize that it is absolutely impossible with differing opinions can for them to do their jobs come together in a forum of without the full and unconditional support of the Iraqi regime? However, if after 17 resolutions, the U.N. will still not endorse action to disarm Saddam Hussein, then the revelation of the U.N.'s impotence will hopefully be a wake up call to nations across the globe. 

### What's the law?

Q. I hired a band to play two sets. They requested to be paid in cash because of previous problems with checks. After the first set, the band left. I asked for half of my money back because they didn't keep the agreement but they refused. I don't have a contract. Can I still go to small claims court?

A. First, you do have a contract. You seem to think the only enforceable "contract" is a formal agreement on a piece of paper. In fact, any agreement, oral or written, may be a contract. As far as the law is concerned, your oral agreement that you would pay the band and they would

play two sets is a contract. If they breached that contract by leaving early, you are entitled to damages. In my opinion, the return of half of your money sounds like a fair measure of damages.

I suggest you send them a certified letter asking for your money back. If they do not respond, consider small claims court.

Q. I purchased an RV and since the purchase, I have had nothing but problems. Does Texas have a "right to know" law? Should I have been told of all the problems with the RV?

A. Texas has a law that requires sellers' disclosure. It is called the Texas Deceptive

Trade Practices Act. Basically, what this law requires is that the seller must disclose any known major defect. If the seller knew about the problems with the RV, and he knew you would not buy it at the same price if he told you, the law imposes an obligation to

Under this law, you could be entitled to three times your damages if you were to sue. Before filing a lawsuit, however, you must give the seller 60 days written notice of your claim and the amount of damages you are seeking. Hopefully, once the seller receives your notice letter, he will know that you know your legal rights and will talk with you about resolving the matter.

Q. I just noticed that my will is not notarized. Is it still valid?

A. In Texas, a will does not have to be notarized to be valid. A will that is notarized, however, will be easier and less costly to probate. The form that the notary signs is called a "self-proving affidavit."

I suggest you consider having a new will prepared with a self-proving affidavit. It should not be too expensive to prepare a simple will, and it will save your loved ones a lot of time and money in the future.

lobby for a \$10 million annual increase federally funded research into causes of prematurity. March of Dimes' volunteers from across the state spent Feb. 18 at the Texas Capitol meeting with lawmakers to discuss the foundation's public affairs priorities.

The March of Dimes is a national voluntary health agency whose mission is to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects and infant mortality through research, community services, education and advocacy to save babies.
