



There is a great deal said about irrigation in our county. Now we are truly hoping that we can get it and anything else in the way of an improvement.

Why not agitate a good roads movement? Good roads are just as important along progressive lines, as water works and sewerage systems to our towns; and why not have better highways? We have numbers of roads leading into our towns that are sadly neglected-roads that need cleaning out and grading up in some places where loaded teams can hardly drag through in time which new roads have been opened up heretofore are not in accordance with our road laws in a great many instances.
