## The Town of Hope.

 Hope, New Mexico, is in 14 southwest of Roswell, 20 mile west of Artesia, 150 miles north east of El Paso.The town, which is the place
where the Lincoln County Bap. tist association was held las week, is one of the many remark able demonstrations which Nev Mexico furnishes of the trans
formation of a barren, sightles formation of a barren, sightless
dessert into a magnifcient and growing intensive farming dis trict. When the wagon train of the pioneers halted upon the beautiful Peuasco River, some
twenty years ago, they, looked twenty years ago, they looked
around upon one of the most God-forsaken wildernesses o desolation the eye or man eve
rested upon; and their triend asted upon; and their triend culed and besought them to de sist from their fool hardy at tempt to wrest a fortune from
the hopeless prospect. But here was also a wide spreading prairie of Gama grass round
about them, plenty of water in about them, plenty of water in
he RioPenasco which came in he Rio Penasco which came in
