Net cash income of American farmers in 1957 was down to \$11.5 billion. That is 4 per cent below the figure for 1956. It is the lowest for any year since 1942.

What happened? Cash income went down and production costs went up. There was a drop of \$350 million in cash receipts from sales of farm products. And there was a \$600 million increase in productions costs.

Prices received by farmers have gone down 20 per cent since 1951. Farm operating costs have gone up 15 per cent during the same period.

long-continued unsolved agricultural crisis.

With 21,000,000 Americans living on farms, high industrial wages and booming business cannot last very long when the farmers are in a depression.

So many farmers have been put out of business by the policies of the present Administration that the unemployment problem has been greatly aggravated.
