ELLIOTT WELL BEING TESTED

ENGINES AND MACHINERY MOVED WEDNESDAY. TESTING BEGINS TOMORROW

On Wednesday of this week, the last of the machinery and paraphernalia for testing the irrigation wells, was moved to the Elliott farm in the Bethel community. Thursday was spent in getting engine and machinery installed and proper arrangements for housing and feeding the crew. Tomorrow the work of making the test will begin. Mr. Elliott is ready for the water, being an old irrigator and knowing the value of water, he has his land ready for the water, having made his main ditch and laterals before the test crew arrived. It is hoped and believed that this well can be fully and satisfactorily tested by end of present week. It is also believed that it will show greater output of water than any well yet tested.

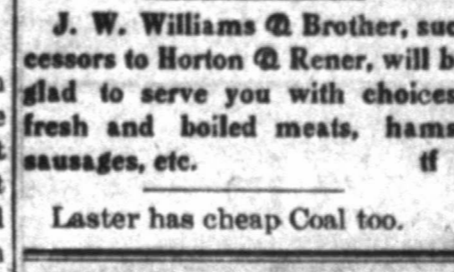

Protecting Trees from Rabbits During Winter.

Many fruit and shade trees are lost annually by being girdled by rabbits. The season in which most of the damage is done is during the winter months. As that season is approaching it would be well for the orchardist to have in mind some form of protection for his trees in order to prevent such a loss.

With regard to remedies, there are several advocated and these are usually of two forms. The trunk of the tree is either painted with some solution or wrapped with some material. Many patent protectors are on the market, such as wire coils and thin sheets of wood. The wire coil protector slips over the tree and can be left on the year around and until the tree gets too large for the coil. Then it must be removed. The price of these protectors is about \$2.25 per one hundred. When the sheets of wood are used they are put on the trees in the fall and are removed in the spring. A strip of the wood sufficiently large to extend around the tree is used. It is tied on with some kind of cord, care being taken to tie it firmly so it will stay. There are many more methods of protecting trees than the above, but only the two used at the station by the horticultural department will be described in this bulletin. These are as follows:

LIME WASH WITH ARSENATE OF LEAD.

Paint the trunks of the trees with lime wash made rather thick, to which has been added about one-half pound of arsenate of lead to each pailful of the wash. The lime wash is made in the usual manner by mixing lime and water. After adding the arsenate of lead the whole mixture should be thoroughly stirred to mix the poison with the wash. This wash is put on with an ordinary paint brush and the trunk of the tree should be covered as high as the rabbits can reach. It should be renewed if there is any indication of injury to the trees by rabbits. One-half pound of Paris green may be substituted for the arsenate of lead.

WRAPPING TREES WITH PAPER

The trunks of the trees are wrapped with paper, the paper being tied on with cord to hold it in place. Old newspapers may be used for the above purpose, the care necessary being to see that the paper entirely covers the trunk of the tree high enough to prevent the rabbits reaching the exposed portion above the paper.

The last two remedies mentioned and described were used during the past winter and spring at the station and they gave entire satisfaction. The latter method of wrapping the trunks of the trees with paper is the cheaper of the two and if the proper care is exercised in putting on the paper, no other protection will be necessary. The paper should be removed in the latter part of spring, after danger from rabbits gnawing the tree is past.

The planter should not fail to pay particular attention to this matter of protecting his trees during winter. A little care expended along this line will save his trees from injury and will more than pay the expense. The time to begin this protection is just as soon as the leaves fall and before any damage is done.

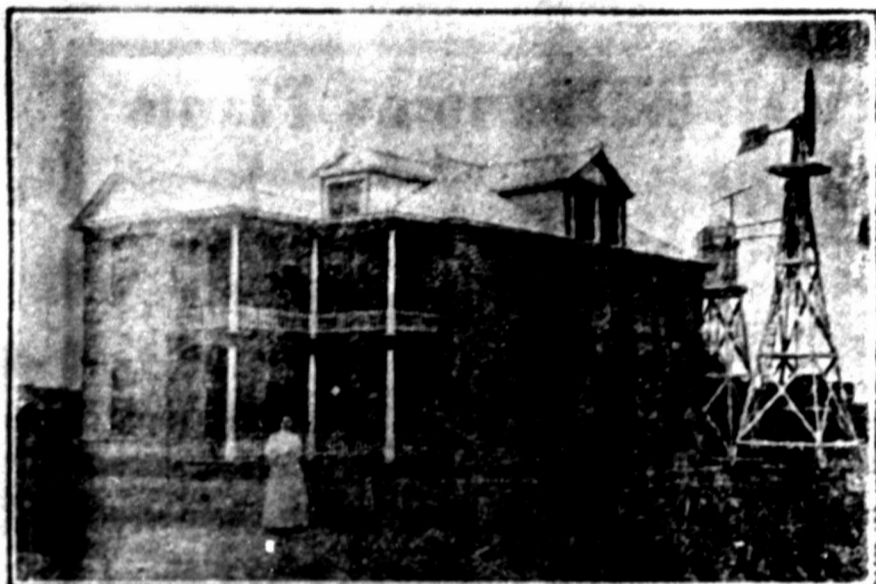

ANOTHER DISASTROUS FIRE

PROPERTY VALUED AT TWELVE THOUSAND DOLLARS DESTROYED SATURDAY MORNING

Saturday morning at 8 o'clock the citizenship of Portales were aroused by the fire alarm to find that the Haskew building on the southwest side of square was in a solid sheet of flames and that it would take heroic effort to save the whole line of wooden buildings. Owing to a false alarm in the earlier part of the night the people as a whole were slow in responding. Some, however, were on the spot in a few seconds. Others came later, and among others the fire company all of whom did as fine work as may be witnessed in a large city. The wooden buildings

were so closely joined however that no sort of effort could avail to save the buildings; and all efforts were turned to save the goods and furniture in each instance. There was such a sudden burst and mass of flames coming from Williams & Lawrence's furniture establishment that nothing could be done to save anything from this building or the T. E. Landers clothing establishment. Though we learn that a dozen or more suits of clothing were saved from the Landers stock. On the west side very few things could be saved from the tin shop of Adams & Crow who were among the heaviest losers with lightest insurance. Most of the R. M. Sanders stock of saddles and harness were saved, though almost none of his harness tools were saved. Mr. Sander's two

buildings—one occupied by Adams & Crow and one by his own business went up in smoke. Then came the Schweining building, recently vacated by Adams & Crow was next in order and was quickly consumed, as was also \$400 worth of paint. Finally the fire reached the Sam J. Nixon law office and residence. The furniture was battered up somewhat, but almost everything was saved from the Nixon home and office. Those suffering loss, therefore, are as follows:
T. E. Landers clothing stock \$350, covered by insurance.
R. G. Bryant, building, value \$300, no insurance.
Williams & Lawrence, furniture stock, value \$2000, insurance \$2000.
Mr. Haskew, building, value \$1000, insurance \$800.
Adams & Crow, tinshop stock,

value \$1550, insurance \$400.
R. M. Sanders, 2 buildings, value \$2400, insurance \$1000, saddle and harness stock, value \$3000, mostly saved, insurance \$1000.
E. A. Schwiening, building, value \$1500, insurance \$600; also paint stock \$400, no insurance.
Sam J. Nixon, building \$1000, insurance \$600.
The question of incendiaries has been prominent in all the discussions of this fire, for the simple reason that it was so sudden and overwhelming as to indicate that it must have had a fluid starter. On the other hand, it could have ignited a match and let it drop into the embankment and caused the sudden explosive like fire which quickly burst through the rear end of the Williams & Lawrence furniture establishment and swept away \$12,000 worth of property. The truth will perhaps never be known.
