The belated train Tuesday night brought President C. H. Rittenhouse and Secretary W. A. Vincent of the Western Construc-

Fuller of Phoenix, (1) to close up the legal phase of the ivrigation contract and (2) to group as far as possible the land subscribed to the irrigation proposition so that it will come within the possible limits of the pole lines as indicated by the contract and also in the talks of men before the people.

As a matter of fact the agreement was that the transmission lines of this proposition were to be sixty miles for 10,000 acres,
whereas as the subscriptions of land now stand the transmission whereas as the subscriptions ind licated by map presented at the meeting this morning, the entire acreage can be an grouped that it will only take 72 miles of transmission line to reach every farm. This being the case, it is hardly fair to ask the Western Construc tion Company to spread out transmission lines for 180 miles

No NEW Con hur or chan or hororron By some sort of mistake it was rumored abroad that it would be necessary to change the entire irrigation proposition to satisfy demands of the Western Construction Company. The fact is no such thought ever entered their minds. On the contrary, it was
found, by referring to the map of land subseribed for trrigation, that instead of coveriage 60 milles of trasesmiseion line ae waeatipu. ifted in the contract, the anbectiptiont of lind cained for s thins mission line of 130 miles. As this doubling of the tranamiksion line would cost the Western Construction Company $\$ 50,000$, we have no right to expect them to stand for it.

## MASS MEETIM

At a mass meeting held at the court house at Portales today at $100^{\circ}$ clock and continued over into afternoon, the proposition to group the small tracts of land in parcels of 160 acres, asking those subscribing less acreage to join with some one of their neighbors, was heartily adopted; because (1) It cuts down the cost of the drilling and equipping the well, each one bearing his part of same; and (2) because it reduces the cost from $\mathbf{\$ 4 3} \mathbf{~ e m}$ acre for $\mathbf{4 0}$ acre tract to $\$ 35$ and the others in proportion-this item alone saving our people thousands of dollaro-raed (3) because in this way it will be possible for us to set acreage within the 72 milee of transmission line and will enable us to close the proposktion and ship the machinery within next five days.

Hough increased his to 208 acrea; Mr. Ed J. Neer came in for 246 acres; while Messrs. Webber and Lykens signed for 440 acres or more. It is imposetble at present to know how soon the readjustment will be made but it is certain that it will be consummated before the 15th.
