THE LFE OF ABRMMMLHCOM.
Abraham Lincoln was born Feb. 12, 1809, Hardin County,
Kentuckey, and died April 14, Kens.
1865.
He came up from the humblest
walks of life, his father havin Walks of life, his father having
been a poor farmer in the pioner been a poor farmer in the pioneer
settlements of Kentucky. When Ligcoln was but seven years old, the Lincoln family moved to the state of Indiana, built a log cabin and began a failing struggle with poyerty, hardships, and toil whigh
was the constant lot of Abrahain Ligcoln in his early life. At the age of twenty-one his father
moved to a farm in the prafrie moved to a farm in the prafrie
state of Ilinois, where another log cubin was built and the strug. Ele familiar to
was repeated.
Until the age of twenty-one his enwre education amounted to but
twelve months of schooling, and yet during his youthapd younser
manhood be so applied bimself to the acquiring of an education
that he became one of the wisest that he became one of the wisest
statesmen of his time. His biog? raphers dwell in detail on the ling geometry by the fickering light of the fireplace; and how

Before going to the presidency he had been but little in public life. He had served as caption in the Black Hawk war, was a member of the fuinois state legislature for several terms, and had
served a single term in congres served a single term in cong
during the Mexican war. As a lawyer, be rose to the he of his profession in the state. zation of the Republican party,
be became one of its most promi nent leaders. His debate with Douglas while contesting for the
senatorship of Illinois revealed senatorship of ilinois revealed
his keen insight into the ecience his keen insight into the ecience
of goyernmert, and brought himp prominently before the country netion. As a leader he was king among men. His beart was as
tender as a child's, and he loved child nature with such a tenderness and affection that wherever the went he won, the love of athld
ren. No man more fully realized the peril of the republic thalized Lineoln when be was elected president of the United States.
On bidding his friends and neigebers goed bye at Spting feld and upon setting out for
Wankington to assume the neins of government, he said, "Inow
leave, not knowing when I will return, with a task before me
greater than that which rested greater than that which rested
upon Washington, without the apon Washington, without the
