NEW DRY FARMING PLAN BY A MAN OF EXPERIENCE.

Man Discovers How to Raise Sure Crop Every Year Without Winter Snows or Spring Rains-Plan Given.

Recently we read in one of our exchanges this interesting story of a dry farmer who has hit upon what we believe to be the only sure plan of raising a crop every year in this section of country-no matter whether it snows in winter or rains in spring or not.

After years of experience, a man whose name is R. Branagh and who is now holding a position in the Agricultural Department in the government of old Mexico, learned three things about dryfarming which applies to all of this part of the semi-arid Southwest, viz:-First, that the rains always come sometime during the summer and usually after the middle of June.

Second, that the farmer who proposes to raise a crop successfully every year must plant late, in June preferably, and plant stuff which he knows can come to maturity, say from first of July to middle of October, and avotd planting in the spring for the reason that the spring rains fail to come more often than they come and even the showers which do fall in the spring are not sufficient in most cases to carry the growing crop over to the summer rainy season; and on this account, the dry farmer in this section must also avoid planting stuff which requires a long time to mature. 
