Come alive, men, and let us have the Hundred Thousand Acre Irrigation Club, andlet us launch these great for ward movements with an organ ization spirit and purpose as will revolutionize this community within the next six months. irrigating the 5 acke: tracts <br> In another column we are giv ing a rough estimate of the cost of installing small pumping plants on our large number of five acre tracts, to be pumped by electric power from the city power plant. The chances are that Mr. Lomax will be able to furnish this power mach cheap er than here figured. But even according to the figures here given, it would seem to be not only possible but practical for at least 100 truck gardeners to make good on the five acre tracts close around Portales. And the Santa Fe Railway has authorized the statement that if a given number of truckers will launch into this proposition for the com ing season, they will furnish them with an exceedingly low freight rate and the best and quickest service out of Portales th Clovis, Texico, Hereford, Can yon and Amarillo; and as we are about half way between Roswell and Amarillo, there is every rea son to believe that we could, with the advantages in freight thus af forded, practically supply all those towns with garden truck and produce. How many of you want to figure on this proposi tion? Mr. Lomax is here and expects to start the town power plant about the middle of Novem ber and he is ready to submit figures on the proposition. Healy, promoter of the line south from Texico, was a visitor in Portales yesterday and today, having come down upon the invitation of the citizens to talk over the matter of getting another road for Portales I alley This invitation is the result of the earnest determination on the part of Portales boosters to get together an attractive bonus for the building of some road which will give the Valley an outlet to the Ft. Worth market and the Gulf lines and while it is not yet definitely known just what com plexion Mr. Healy's visit will place upon the matter, it is quite certain that the purpose of the soliciting committee is to go right ahead with raising a $\$ 50$, ooo bonus, and it is confidently expected that as soon as this matter is arranged on a secure basis the desired results will be secured. <br> At a mass meeting of the citi zens held last Saturday after noon, about $\$ 10,000$ was sub scribed to swell the bonus, and while there is no reason to doubt that the full amount will be forthcoming, it is urged by the committee that each unit of our citizenship come up to the "lick log" and say how much for him. This is a matter of vital impor tance to every citizen composing this community and no one should halt and let the other fel low shoulder the whole burden. At this meeting the organization was made permanent in the selection of T. J. Molinari as chair man, the nomination coming from Judge A. B. Seay, chair man pro tem. The secretary of the previous meeting was made permanent scribe, and the soiic iting committee's personnel is the same in the persons of Geo. Williamson, A. T. Monroe, Judge H. F. Jones, T. L. Keen, W. O. Oldham, T. E. Mears and Walter Brandon. The meeting last Saturday was addressed by Cbairman Molinari, Judge H. F. Jones and T. L. Keen. All these addresses were to the point, be ing patriotic in the extreme, and were all well received by the au | dience. <br> The Herald proposes to keep this matter before our people and hopes that by next issue we may have something interesting to relate as a result of $\mathbf{M r}$. Healy's visit. He makes a proposition which very nearly offers what we need in the way of better railway facilities and it goes without saying that if this gentleman can come up with the goods, Portales will be there good and strong. Let the agitation continue. There is always a talking period in the path of every great movement and this small beginning is not to be de spised. As Judge Jones pointed out in one of his characteristic heart-to-heart talks last Satur day afternoon, the existence of several nearby towns upon the New Mexico map today can be accounted for in no other man ner than by the fact that Por tales, with her unlimited natural advantages, has sit idly by and allowed these less favored places to gain recognition by sheer getup and get. And these remarks by the venerable Judge are seasoned with wisdom, too. <br> LIGHT AID SEWER WORK PROGRESSIIG. <br> The operating company which was organized for the purpose of leasing the city light, sewer and water plant, is about the livest thing in town these days, Manager Lomax leading the way with all the energy which has charac. terized his introduction to our citizens. The company has organized with T. E. Mears, president, A. T. Monroe, vice president, T. G. Lomax, secretary treasurer, which will be the offi cial staff and George Williamson and these three officers will form the board of directors. Most of the stock has been subscribed and paid in and the charter will be applied for at once. <br> Mr. Lomax is projecting the work of making connections with the light and sewer systems just as fast as he can get the materials, having a good sized force of men at work now. It will not be long now before Portales will be in the full glare of her own light. |
