Questions raised about fate of Cargill plant

There were more questions than answers at the community-wide meeting held Monday with all the taxing entities present.

DISD Board President David Schaeffer presided at the specially called meeting. First us were representatives of the McDonald Group, which presented a letter of intent from Merrill Lynch for \$50 million to help North Texas Ethanol LLC get a plant up and going here.

John Helsley, who also works for the county setting up its rail district, said he had gotten Brad McDonald, a Houston financier, interested in the proposal, but had trouble getting a go-ahead on the project.

Mayor Wayne Collins said he did not give the go-ahead because there are several other companies that have expressed interest in opening the ethanol plant and they have more experience in the ethanol arena.

Schaeffer said that Cargill has

indicated that the city council will be the entity that decides who gets the plant.

Collins, who now works for Dimmitt Ethanol, said he will no longer vote on council decisions on the plant.

Chaun Gunstream, who chairs the Dimmitt Economic Development Committee which funded the search for a buyer for the plant, said his committee had not gotten the kind of reports from Collins that they would have liked. However, Collins on Tuesday

indicated that he will have proposals from the other groups looking at the plant within a few weeks. Then he will take them to the Council and the Economic Development Committee.

Collins and his partners have expressed interest in developing the ethanol plant, but Collins said he is looking for the best deal for the city. In January 2005, Cargill announced it was closing its fructose plant here permanently. Since then, Collins and the Economic Development Commit-

tee have been trying to find a way to re-open the plant and making ethanol appears to be the best option. However, Cargill will not hand over title to the plant until the lawsuits by the taxing entities are dropped. The city and county have dropped their suits; the hospital district and school board have not done so, but the DISD board is set to meet June 12. The lawsuits were trying to recoup money from Cargill that had been given in tax abatements. It is hoped an ethanol plant would employ 60-80.

Burn ban back in place for county Method for lifting it should it rain was put in place

If you blinked you missed the lifting of the burn ban. Commissioners met on Saturday and lifted the ban for 72 hours. It went back into effect on Tuesday, June 6, at noon.

However, at a special meeting on Monday the commissioners agreed that welding can still be done as long as the proposed sites are examined by a commissioner or the county judge before the welding begins.

The commissioners also agreed that outside cooking may continue as long as the cookers are self-contained.

And finally, the commissioners voted to give County Judge Bill Sava permission to lift the ban should we get enough rain to warrant it.

Sava can lift the ban county wide or in portions, depending on reports he gets of rainfall. Sava said he'll be glad to answer questions about whether enough rain has fallen in the coming weeks - either at home or at his office during business hours.

"The Relay for Life is an event that is set up to help in the fight against cancer, and we would like everyone in the County to come out and help in that fight," Brockman said. "Everyone is welcome and no contribution is too small in fight against this terrible disease."

An empty tomb

"For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures," I Corinthians 15:3-4

The dawn of a new day has made its presence as some women make their way to a tomb to anoint the body of their Savior.

It was early, just after sunrise on the first day of the week, the third morning after their Lord had been crucified on the cross.

You could imagine the emotional state of the woman as they made their way to the tomb.

There was the question, who will move the stone from the entrance?

The stone was of massive size and sealed by the Roman Government. Who will roll the stone away?

Upon arrival to the tomb, the question was answered.

The stone of large magnitude had been rolled away! Remember

the emotional state of the woman from beginning.

They enter the tomb to find no body lying there in grave cloths.

Greeted by a young man dressed in white, they began to worry and be alarmed. "Where is the body of our Lord and Savior?"

One would desperately as at this moment. "Don't be alarmed, don't be afraid. You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, whom was crucified. He has risen! You see? Look! He is not here! Go! Tell His disciples that He has risen! He has gone ahead of you into Galilee, there you will see Him! Just as He had told you before. He's alive! Go tell everyone you know! He's alive! Go now!"

This account of the most magnificent event in the existence of Christianity was taken from several of the Gospel writings. (Matthew 28:1-10, Mark 16:1-8, Luke 24:1-12)

I have taken different parts of them to bring out the message of urgency.

Try and put yourself in the shoes of the women as they encounter the empty tomb. Imagine the tone of voice of the man in white telling about what had happened, the urgency within his actions.

This magnificent event needs to be told.

Share it with you friends, share how it has impacted your life.

We are not to literally drop what we are doing to go out and share the message, but share the message as we go about our daily lives.

Our lives should be revolving around the message and making it our mission to be Christ-like examples as we live on planet earth.

There is indeed an urgency, yet Christ will use each of us according to His will. He is alive my friends, let us be motivated to tell! Look up once in a while.

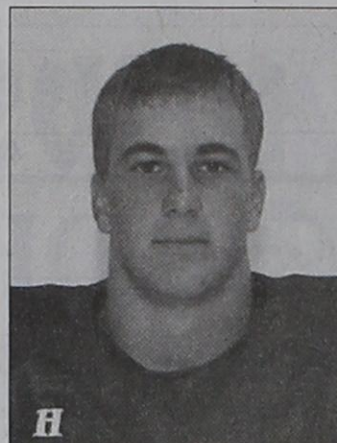

Gerbers will play in Greenbelt Bowl

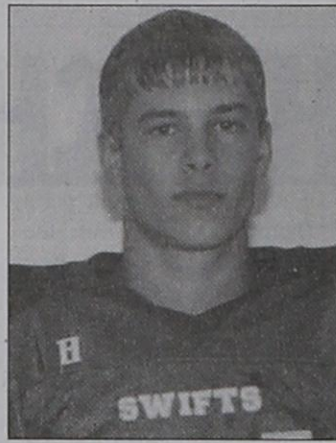

Remember to Fly your Flags On Flag Day June 14

Here are some often asked questions at flying the flag at "half staff"
(half-mast is for ships only).

Q. When Should the Flag be at half-staff?

A. (a) The Flag is half-staffed on Memorial Day, from sunrise until noon; it is displayed at full-staff from noon until sunset.

(b) By order of the President of the United States, or by the Governor of any State, territory or possession. On occasion, heads of several departments and agencies of the U.S. Government may direct the Flag to half-staff deemed proper to do so.

Q. Should the Flag be half-staffed on Veterans Day?

A. No, except it would be acceptable during a Veterans Day ceremony when Taps is being sounded, volleys fired, or wreaths are being laid (A.C.)
