Auspicious Beginning of New Industry for Women.

San Antonio, May 22.-Mrs. Belle

Barnes, at 803 South Alamo street, has in her parlor 50000 big, healthy silk worms busily engaged in weaving silk cocoons. Mrs. Barnes has made a leases expire the first of the coming OLD ARE OFFICERS REELECTED study of silk culture and is firmly confident that it can be made profitable in Texas, especially in San Antonio, where the mulberry tree, that furnishes food and material for the worm, is so abundant. She secured eggs from the government agricultural department and hatched them out in her parlor in twenty-four hours after receiving them and then placed them in mulberry leaves for a month, after which time the worms began weaving the cocoons. The cocoons completed and nearly completed and in different other states, adorn the walls of the room, hang from the under part and ment commanders, Gens. Lee, Walker legs of the tables, from the rungs of chairs and the legs of chairs, while elsewhere in the room can be seen the worms by the hundreds feeding on the mulberry leaves.

Mrs. Barnes has great piles of cocoons completed, and when the worms have finished up their work will express all to Washington and will be paid for them by the agricultural department. Next year she proposes to have 50,000 worms, and if successful, will increase the number the following year to 1,000,000.


