



About Our " Pennies."

A cent is a little thing, but in the aggregate it is mighty. We speak of the "copper cent," but it is not entirely copper. Its composition is 95 per cent copper, 3 per cent tin and 2 per cent zinc. That alloy is in reality bronze, and the official name of the cent is "bronze." There used to be f. copper cent, but an act discontinuing its coinage was passed in 1857. For seven years (1857-1864) we had a nickel cent, and up to 1857 a copper halt cent. No more cents are to be made by the Philadelphia mint for at least a year, unless a special order is issued by the treasury. In the last five years 3,000,000,000 "pennies" have been ship-

ped from the mint to various parts of the country. Between July 1, 1902, and June 1, 1903, 89,600,000 bronze cents were coined. The total number of cents coined since the mints were established, in 1793, is 4,281,141,393. Coin-age was suspended in 1816 and 1824.
